US Fishing Boat Sailed In Trouble

HALIFAX, N.S., (U.P.)—Royal Canadian air force search and rescue officials said today the United States trawler Mary Jane, believed to have gone missing about 80 miles southwest of Halifax.

A navy craft left here to go to the rescue of the vessel.

Plight of the Mary Jane was reported to marine radio here this morning by the U.S. trawler Kingfish.

GOP Women Set Theme Of Program

Work and Win will be the theme of Republicans in 1952, according to Mrs. H. D. Peterson, Dallas, speaker before the Klamath county council of Oregon Republican women at luncheon in the Winema hotel Monday noon. Mrs. Peterson, in giving practical suggestions for conducting the local campaign, said that the campaign has four phases, first organization; second, inventory, third, education, and the fourth, harvest. She compared conducting a successful political campaign to the conduct of a successful sales campaign.

Mrs. Peterson emphasized that we must keep our two party systems in the United States to retain the things that are precious to us.

She said that 20 million persons in the United States are not yet registered and that 30 million did not vote in the last election.

She gave as Klamath county's goal the registration of 2005 persons over 20 who are not yet registered. Figures on the population of Klamath county as 42,150; the population over 21 as 26,629 and the registered population as 23,664.

Mrs. George T. Gerlinger, Portland, related anecdotes of her recent European trip.

She told of visiting the English house of commons and related the extremes of poverty which six years of socialism has visited upon the English people. She stated that without exception people of all nations, said "If we could just get to America." She said that of 29 women in the house of commons of England, only four are conservatives.

Bowles Tours Over Calcutta Today

CALCUTTA, India, (U.P.)—Chester Bowles, the new U.S. ambassador to India, toured Calcutta today.

When he arrived in India, Bowles promised to see all sections of the country so he could know its ordinary people as well as its leaders. He came to Calcutta yesterday for a three-day visit.

Bowles suggested to a press conference that different farming methods, perhaps cooperatives in place of the individual farms of an acre or less, might help the country. Better methods he said, could produce more food and so save foreign exchange to build up industries.

He said India may ask the U.S. for more grain, as it did last year, because there is a prospective shortage of five million tons.

DETROIT, (U.P.)—A shy, but hot-tempered assistant accountant was sought for questioning today in the bloody hatchet and knife slayings of his mother and 11-year-old sister. No formal charge has been placed against him.

The bodies of Mrs. Daisy Maurer 44, and her daughter Janet, were found last night by the husband and father, Lawrence Maurer, 46. Their bodies had been hacked and their throats ripped open.

The hunted youth is Kenneth Maurer, 18-year-old tree trimmer and amateur gardener. He was last seen leaving the house early Monday. A medical examiner said the two women had been slain two to three hours before.

ROME, (U.P.)—There was a spare room in the parish vicarage of the flooded town of Loreo, in the Po delta. That's why Gabriele Marangoni, 24, and his girl Solides Benedetti, got married when they did.

Their story of love in the floods was told today by a correspondent for a Rome newspaper.

He wrote that the young people had been keeping company for some time and were "almost engaged."

When the floods came, both lost their homes, but stayed behind in Loreo so older members of their families could be saved. Only about 200 of Loreo's 6000 residents remained in the town.

With no place to go, Gabriele and Solides appealed to the parish priest.

Yes, he said, he had a spare room in the vicarage, but it would hardly be right to let an unmarried couple sleep together in it.

Gabriele and Solides looked in each other's eyes. Then Gabriele turned to the priest and said, "we'll get married."

So the young couple, the mayor, the deputy mayor, the chief of police and the priest poled over to the church in a barge.

They stood in ankle deep water before the altar while the priest married them. Then they boated over to the city hall for a civil wedding.

The old police chief broke out his last two bottles of wine and raided the police rations. The wedding feast was held in the police station.

So now a new family lives in the spare room at the parish house.
