

Board Of Control Lays Down First Rulings To Determine Prison Routine

By PAUL W. HARVEY JR., SALEM, O.—The state board of control announced today a policy to operate the state penitentiary "as a sincere effort to rehabilitate, as well as to restrain."

"Each inmate is to be regarded as an individual, in need of varying degrees of restraint, treatment and supervision. Hence, our ultimate objective can be achieved only by studying each inmate as an individual and treating him in accordance with his specific needs, so that he may eventually assume the responsibilities of citizenship," the board's statement said.

The board, which includes Governor Douglas McKay, Secretary of State Earl J. Newby, and State Treasurer Walter J. Pearson, also specifically separated the jobs of Alexander and O'Malley.

Superintendent Alexander is charged with operation of all prison industries, farming, construction and finances. Warden O'Malley is in charge of custody of prisoners, supervision of employees, preparation of rules for inmates and convicts, and maintaining discipline.

The policy statement—first ever adopted by the board and which will lay the groundwork for the widespread reforms being carried out by O'Malley—sets up a classification system. This system, which O'Malley already has started, calls for classifying each prisoner according to the kind of supervision he needs, and his work and educational program.

British Welcome Phumiphon Aduldet

SINGAPORE, O.—British officials put on full dress today to greet King Rama IX (Phumiphon Aduldet) of Thailand, returning to his homeland to reign after a year and a half in Switzerland.

The king with his queen, Sirikit, and their seven-month old daughter, Princess Ubol Ratana, arrived on the Danish liner S. S. Meonia for a one-day stay enroute to Bangkok.

They were greeted by Malcolm MacDonald, British commissioner-general for southeast Asia, Governor Sir Franklin Gimson, commander in chief of British Far East land and sea forces, and members of the diplomatic corps.

The report also includes these highlights:
Religion—Inmates of all institutions should be permitted to worship and to receive religious instruction according to their own desires.
Education—It shall be the policy of the penitentiary to provide each inmate with as much functioning education as his capacities will permit. Particular emphasis shall be placed upon enrolling all inmates under 29 years of age.
Recreation—All inmates who are capable of participating in active sports should be encouraged to do so in the interest of building and maintaining physical and mental health.

Inmate councils—The establishment of inmate advisory councils shall be encouraged.
Work—The present industrial program shall be continued and intensified to the end that not only will the products contribute to the cost of maintaining and improving standards at the penitentiary and other state institutions, but shall also provide a medium for the training of inmates in useful skills.
Personnel—A recruit and in-service training program shall be developed and maintained as a device for getting the maximum quality of services from the personnel employed.
Food and clothing—All inmates should be fed a wholesome and nutritionally adequate diet. Sufficient and proper clothing to protect the health of the inmates shall be provided.


