

Service on 10 State Boards Takes Lots Of Governor's Time; Mansion Need Eyed

SALEM, (U)—Now that the legislature has become conscious of the need for reorganizing Oregon's state government, it might do something about the fact that the busy governor has to serve on 10 state boards.

Gov. McKay isn't kicking about it although he thinks things would be much better for the state if he didn't have to spend so much time in board meetings.

Also, he points out, the system might be criticized from the standpoint that a governor—if he wanted to—could throw his weight around and dominate some of the boards. That is especially true of those boards which conclude ordinary citizens as members.

At these board meetings, however, Gov. McKay said, "but, I think that's the proper thing to do. Besides, I like to talk to people and I like to hear what they have to say."

Of all his board jobs, being chairman of the board of control is the most important. This board runs all state institutions, and there is some agitation to do away with it. The American Mental Health Assoc. and Portland City club would like to see a state mental health authority, consisting of doctors and laymen, run the state hospitals.

The board of control doesn't think much of the idea, believing it has done a good job. The board's wings are clipped by the 1951 legislature which took away the board's job of purchasing all state supplies. The purchasing job was given to the new state finance department, which is under the governor.

Another change McKay would like to see is to build an executive mansion.

Bills to have a governor's mansion have almost been passed by the legislature. "I don't want a governor's mansion for myself," McKay explains, "because I have my own home in Salem. But it's pretty tough on a governor who has to come to Salem and find a house."

Gov. McKay spends a lot of time visiting with his callers. He's very easy to see, too. His door is always open to the press, and almost anyone can get an appointment with him.

"Maybe I spend too much time seeing people," McKay said, "but, I think that's the proper thing to do. Besides, I like to talk to people and I like to hear what they have to say."

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Soft Water Test On Cows Slated

PULLMAN, Wash., (U)—Washington State College today announced an experiment to see if cows that drink only soft water will produce more and better milk.

The WSC dairy department test will use 28 Holstein, Jersey and Guernsey cows in the three-month experiment.

For six weeks, half the cows will drink only soft water. The other half will drink hard water. They'll reverse the routine for the last six weeks.

Dr. H. T. Blosser, who is in charge of the experiment, said it's the first on the soft water theory. He said results will be announced in about six months.

Chapman Sees CVA Approval

PORTLAND, (U)—Interior Sec. Oscar Chapman believes the controversial Columbia valley administration program eventually will be adopted.

Here on his first visit to the Pacific Northwest since he took office, Chapman said in an interview yesterday, "I think the question is how fast we can push it (CVA). The problem is to get the people of the area informed of the value of a properly integrated development program."

Chapman also said he expects congress to vote support of the Hell's canyon dam on the Snake river and the proposed power link between the Oregon Bonneville and the California Shasta system.

Chapman will speak before the Oregon Horticultural society at Corvallis tonight. He will address the Portland City club and on Saturday he will attend a Democratic luncheon here. He will speak in Spokane Monday night.

"I'm paying my own way to Spokane," he said. "I'm here on departmental business and I don't mix politics and business."
