### DDT, Chapman Featured At Annual Hort Confab

What danger is there to humans from DDT? That's a question to be discussed by Dr. J. Monte Johnston, Wenatchee, Wash., at the Oregon State Horticultural society meeting November 29 and 30 on the Oregon State college campus.

A U.S. public health service toxicology laboratory physician, Dr. Johnston will report work that has been underway in which organic phosphates and DDT, a widely used insecticide, have been studied.

The appearance of Dr. Johnston at the society's 66th annual meeting has been announced by the program committee headed by Paul Skinner, Medford. Sessions both days will get underway at 9 a.m. and will be held in the OSC campus Memorial Union building.

Climax of the two-day meeting will be a speaking appearance by Oscar Chapman, secretary of interior, Thursday evening, November 29, in the coliseum building. The program, which will include talks by Governor Douglas McKay and President A. L. Straub at Oregon State college, will begin at 8 p.m.

### Two Cent Handling Cost Per Quart Portland Milk

It costs Portland retail stores an average of about two cents a quart to handle milk, according to a survey of 31 retail outlets in the city conducted by agricultural economists of the Oregon State college experiment station.

The fact that size affects unit costs was borne out by the survey figures. Costs varied from .97 to 7.15 cents a quart, with the larger stores reporting the lowest costs.

When grouped according to size, it was found that large stores included in the survey got by for about a quarter of a cent less than the average of all independent stores beat the chain store average by another quarter of a cent, the report showed.

Complete results of the cost study, including analysis of factors affecting costs, have been published by the experiment station in bulletin number 504, "Costs of Retailing Milk Among a Group of Grocery Stores in Portland, Oregon."

Authors are Gerald E. Korzan of the OSC agricultural economics department and John A. Plummer Jr., of the OSC school of business and technology.
