Board Of Control Backs OLCC In Battle Over Beer Tavern License Renewals

SALEM, (P)—Members of the state board of control agreed Tuesday to give their full support to the state liquor commission in its dispute with the Portland city council over granting and renewing beer licenses.

But the board members took under advisement a resolution by State Treasurer Walter J. Pearson, one of the three board members, calling upon the liquor commission to ignore "the unreasonable and unwarranted restrictions" regarding the licenses which have been passed by the city council.

Governor Douglas McKay and Secretary of State Earl T. Newbry, asserting they give full backing to the liquor commission, said they question whether the board of control should enter the dispute.

Pearson, accusing the Portland city council of trying to bring prohibition to Portland, pointed out that the law says that the liquor commission may receive recommendations from city councils as to whether beer licenses should be granted or renewed. But he pointed out that the liquor commission doesn't have to accept these local recommendations.

Pearson charged that the city council is using this law in an effort to cancel licenses of many beer taverns.

Newbry said he would vote for such a resolution if Governor McKay asked for support.

Governor McKay said he has a hard time getting men to serve on the liquor commission because "nobody wants to be a whipping post for a bunch of politicians. But I wonder if we'd get into hot water if we entered this dispute between the council and the commission."

Pearson said he thinks the board should take action because the "liquor commission needs the backing of some high state body."

"I'm hesitant about getting into this fight," Governor McKay answered. "When the board doesn't have to. It's a fight between the liquor commission and the council, and the commission and the governor will have to take the rap for it. But I sure appreciate your support."

Governor McKay added that he thinks the commission is absolutely right.

Pearson said the tavern licenses expire at the end of this month and that the city council intends to try to get a lot of them cancelled.

Pearson's resolution said that the board members "do resent the unwarranted accusations against the integrity of the members of the liquor commission, members of the legislature, the courts, and other public officials, as expressed in the ill-mannered and irresponsible public statements by certain members of the city council of Portland."
