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Fish Story Told With Pimentos

Add Color Holiday Food With Little Ingenuity

With cookie cutters and a jar of can of whole red pimentos you can quickly turn an everyday dish into a colorful surprise. Leaves, hearts, flowers and other shapes make pretty garnishes. And for special conversation, use pimento-stuffed olives for the eyes of your favorite tuna loaf molded like a fish, and surround the "big fish" with little ones cut from pimiento.

PIMIENTO TUNA LOAF
2 6 1/2-ounce cans tuna
1/4 cup chopped pimento
1/4 cup milk
1 cup soft bread crumbs
2 tablespoons melted butter or margarine
2 eggs
Juice of 1/2 lemon
1 tablespoon scraped onion
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon pepper

Separate tuna into flakes. Scald milk, add bread crumbs, butter or margarine; let stand 5 minutes. Beat until smooth, then combine with tuna, egg yolks, pimento, seasonings and flavoring. Stir in beaten egg whites. Bake in greased loaf pan in moderate oven (350 degrees F) about 35 minutes. Unmold and garnish with little fish cut from whole canned pimentos. Serves six.
