X-Ray May Whip Corns

CHICAGO, (AP)—Some of the nation's top radiologists were told Wednesday their cancer-destroying machines also are effective against one of humanity's more common maladies—corns.

Dr. Sydney J. Hawley, Seattle radiologist, told a convention of the radiological society of North America that X-ray treatment also is a quick way of getting rid of warts.

In a scientific age when medical discussion and papers on X-rays are almost wholly concerned with malignant diseases, Dr. Hawley carefully prefaced his point with these words:

"Probably second only to the common cold are corns as a source of misery. The treatment of these may seem beneath the dignity of a serious radiation therapist; however, considerable relief of discomfort may be obtained, as irradiation will remove the corns."

He said a single treatment generally was enough to remove corns and warts and that about 30 other disorders which are not malignant or skin diseases can be benefited by X-rays.

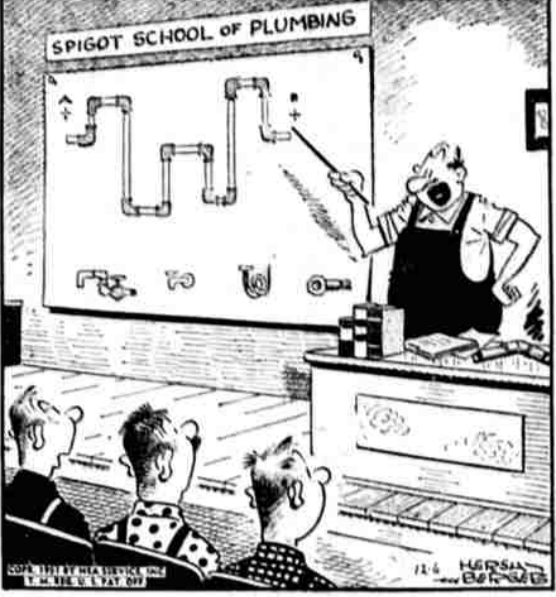

5200 Oregon Vets Attend Colleges

SALEM, (AP)—More than 5200 world war two veterans are enrolled in Oregon colleges, and 6000 more are studying in vocational, business, trade and correspondence schools, the state veterans department said today.

About 2700 others are taking on the job and on farm training.

There are 13,831 veterans in Oregon who get educational aid from the federal government, while 6000 others get state educational aid.

Suicide Has Cops Puzzled

SAVANNAH, Ga., (AP)—This is the way police said it happened:

An elderly woman with a cultured southern accent went to the travelers aid desk in the union station here and asked for directions to Savannah's best hotel. She apparently had arrived on a train from the north.

She wore an inexpensive black coat and hat, and her cotton stockings were twisted.

The travelers aid suggested a less expensive hotel, but the woman insisted on the best.

"I must spend the winter in Savannah," she said.

Soon afterwards she registered at one of Savannah's leading hotels. The name she gave was Amelia Samors; her address, Shelton, Mass. Her only luggage was a small black bag. Before she went to her room she deposited a little more than \$100 with the clerk.

A day passed.

Monday afternoon her body was found in her room. There was a brief note nearby:

"I'm a survivor. The money which I have will pay the hotel bill and the funeral expenses."

Dr. Harold Smith, coroner for Chatham county, said last night the death was a suicide. An overdose of sedatives, perhaps.

He made the customary check.

Plane To Europe To Be Cheaper

NICE, France, (AP)—Europe gets closer for the American air tourist next spring.

The international air transport association agreed last night on tourist rates for the transatlantic plane trip—\$417 round trip in the November-March off-season and \$485 the rest of the year.

The present first class round trip fare is more than \$700.

Pan-American Airways announced it would start the new rate service in May, with four round trips a week in new DC-6B's carrying 82 persons.

For the cheaper rates, the passengers will get "service without frills." The conference still must decide just which services will be retained and which frills will be discarded.

Agreement was reached after seven days of controversy. Pan-American had demanded a \$405 year-round rate.

Other companies announcing they would start cut-rate tourist service in May are Trans World Airlines, British Overseas Airways, Air France, Sabena (Belgian), Scandinavian Airlines, and K.L.M. (Dutch).

Row Looms Over Texas Segregation

HOUSTON, Tex., (AP)—The Houston Post said this city, despite its deep south traditions, will have no white and Negro segregation in the rest rooms of its new airport terminal building.

The post said the decision to have no segregation came after a Negro woman was forcibly removed from "white" taxis at the present terminal building.

The newspaper said the woman's name was not available to it.

In many Texas cities it is illegal for Negroes to ride in cabs designated for use of white persons.

Councilmen, the Post said, while reluctant to discuss the terminal segregation matter, admitted the problem arose at a meeting with the mayor.

The woman was described by the Post as an officer of the national association for the advancement of colored people and influential in the Democratic party.

The Post then related this story: When the NAACP woman returned to Washington, a visit by a civil aeronautics authority official followed. The official threatened to cancel a \$800,000 grant toward cost of the new terminal as well as to refuse to consider an application for \$600,000 in additional aid.

The building, expected to be completed in about a year, will cost \$1,800,000.

The warning was given to Mayor Oscar Holcombe.

Mayor Holcombe discussed it at an unofficial meeting with the councilmen. The council authorized the mayor to remove designations of separate rest rooms for white and Negro persons from the plans.

The mayor said yesterday he could not recall such council action and said plans for the terminal had not been changed.

"Other than that," the mayor said, "I have no comment."

Morals Clause In Movie Contracts Never Invoked

HOLLYWOOD, (AP)—Any discussion of morality in Hollywood brings up the morals clause. But amazingly little is known about it.

The history of the morals clause goes back to the turbulent '20s. The young movie industry was struck by a series of scandals that rocked its foundations.

Wallace Reid, portrayer of the all-American boy, died at the age of 31, a victim of the dope habit. Fatty Arbuckle, lovable comic of slapstick shorts was tried three times for manslaughter in the rape death of a San Francisco girl. After two hung juries, he was acquitted. Director William Desmond Taylor was murdered in an unsolved mystery that involved two actresses, Mary Miles Minter and Mabel Normand.

The Arbuckle case is generally believed to be the reason for introducing the morals clause. Since then, most film players have had it included in their contracts. It reads something like this:

"The artist agrees to conduct himself with due regard to public convention and morals and not commit any act that will tend to degrade him in society or bring him into public hatred, contempt, scorn or ridicule, or that will tend to shock, insult or offend the community or ridicule public morals or decency, or prejudice the producer or the entertainment industry."

That's an eye-opener, isn't it?

Contrary to general belief, not every film player signs the morals clause. At least one studio, Paramount, does not require it. The studio apparently prefers to leave the clause unstated and rely on common law, which might have a broader application.

The legality of the morals clause has never been tried. Some lawyers feel that it might be an infringement of individual freedom assured by the U.S. constitution. But others claim there is basis in common law.

There is one case in which a railroad man was fired because he ran houses of ill repute on the side. His firing was upheld, because the courts agreed he would embarrass the railroad by his outside activities.

On the basis of this and other cases, most of the movie studios still require their actors to sign the moral clause. But it has been invoked only for activity in Communist cells, not in bedrooms and in night clubs.
