Tulana Foes Write Engle

Information supporting protests against a Tulana Farms-reclamation bureau lease was forwarded to Washington, D. C. last night.

The information, gathered by veteran and farm organizations opposing the lease, was sent to U.S. Rep. Clare Engle, of California, and American Legion national headquarters.

The controversial lease would give Tulana another two year's use of 234 acres of Tule sump land which Tulana developed and has farmed since 1945.

The lease, already signed by Tulana, is now in reclamation regional headquarters, Sacramento. Richard Boker, regional reclamation director, said Tuesday the bureau would take no action on the lease for at least two weeks.
