U.N. Airmen Shoot Up Reds
SEOUL, Korea, (AP)—Allied airmen made 107 attacks on front line Communist field guns Thursday in an all-out campaign to make Korea's twilight war even quieter. The abrupt change in United Nations air support tactics came as American jets tangled with the Reds the 11th successive day—a new record for continued air war. One Red jet was reported shot down, one probably destroyed and another damaged. The air force said no Allied planes were hit. Pilots who hit Red artillery said they destroyed 35 guns on the western front.
This would be the equivalent of more than a whole Red artillery regiment's guns. Many others were damaged.

Goshen Doctor Is Medico of Year
LOS ANGELES, (AP)—After virtually half a century of practicing in the same town, Dr. Albert C. Yoder of Goshen, Ind., has been named America's "family doctor of the year."
The award was announced Tuesday at a meeting of the American Medical Association.
Dr. Yoder, 84, started answering medical calls in Goshen on a bicycle in 1902 and still handles a large practice.
Four and a half years ago a doctor more than 20 years his junior declined to take the case of five auto crash victims brought into the Goshen hospital late at night.
"You'll have to call someone younger, I'm too tired," that doctor explained. The physician who answered the call was Dr. Yoder.
Dr. Yoder, who will celebrate his 57th wedding anniversary Christmas day, has four children.

Hoboes Look For Model Flophouse
NEW YORK, (AP)—At least one Fifth Avenue bank doesn't consider a loan to hoboes a bad risk.
But the hoboes, who borrowed \$2000 to set up a "model flophouse," so far can't find a place to spend the money.
With the cash borrowed recently from the modern industrial bank, the hoboes have been roaming the city looking for a suitable vacant lot or condemned building to set up their 50-cents-a-night hotel. The proceeds will go to pay off the mortgage.
At the close of business yesterday, the investment still hung fire. But the hoboes, led by Bozo Clarke, still are hopeful.
Offer to back the project flooded in from coast to coast. But what really decided the bank on the loan was an unidentified New York philanthropist co-signing the note.
