City Hall Face-Lifting Under Way, Offices To Be Shifted All Way Around

An almost complete job of remodeling the interior of the city hall is now underway, directed by Klamath Falls Building Inspector Walt Salisbury. Virtually every office of the city government will be moved from where it is now to someplace else. The moves were made possible by construction of the new jail back of the city hall. The police department, which had occupied the entire first floor of the city hall, moved in there last week. When the remodeling is complete Mayor Bob Thompson and Police Judge Bob Elder will move their private offices down to the first floor, along with the city's principal business office. Persons coming to city hall with the general run of business won't have to climb a couple of flights of stairs anymore. Upstairs the space being vacated by the business office is to be taken over by Elder for his police courtroom. Mrs. Ruth Berry, county treasurer, will move into the present location of the court room, and the recreation office probably will shift around to where the mayor's office is now.
