SKATING PARTY ON BIRTHDAY

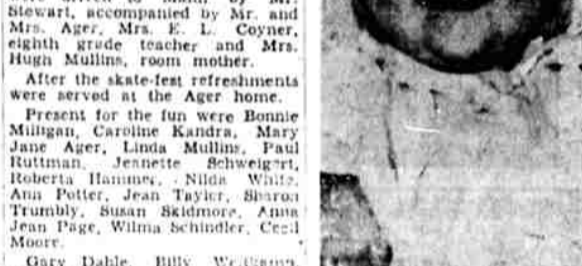
