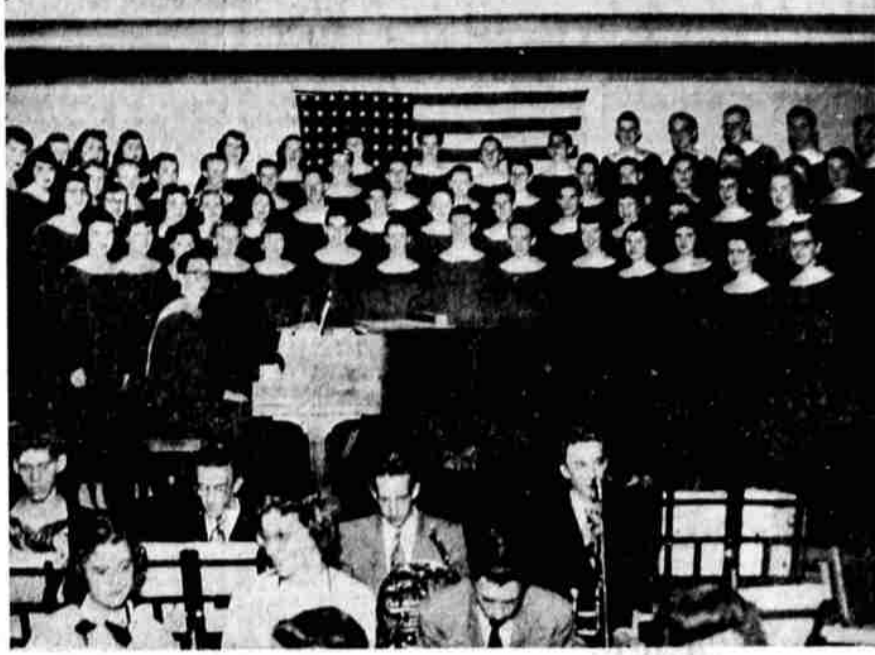


### Oregon Democrats Eye Farley

### Union Chief Denies Charge

SILVER CITY, N.M. (AP)—A mine, mill union official denies left wing leaders plotted at a New York meeting to wreck United States war efforts as Senator McCarthy (R-Wis.) contends.

The senator made the charge to GOP audiences Monday night at Wisconsin University and again last night at Milwaukee.

He played a recording he said was made of the New York meeting October 11.

Maurice Travis of Denver, secretary-treasurer of the international mine, mill and smelter workers (I.M.S.W.), says he was at the New York meeting but describes as "completely inaccurate" McCarthy's tale of what went on.

Travis called the meeting a conference of independent trade union leaders and contradicted McCarthy's statement that the 18 present talked over how Communists inspired recent pineapple, sugar and copper strikes.

"We discussed the same things any union members would discuss," Travis said. "I remember we studied various aspects of the wage stabilization program rather thoroughly."

Travis agreed with McCarthy that one of the 18 at the meeting was Harry Bridges, left wing leader of west coast longshoremen.

Last night in Milwaukee ushers distributed excerpts from the recording. In one, Bridges was quoted as saying, "I think we ought to take certain stands here
