Court Will Hear Appeals On Schools-Bible Issues

WASHINGTON, UP—The Supreme Court will decide in the new year two controversial issues involving schools and religion.

The nine justices agreed to rule whether public schools violate the constitution by releasing students for religious instruction during regular school hours.

Previously, the court agreed to decide whether daily Bible reading in public schools is permissible under the constitution.

The school practices were protested in appeals to the highest tribunal filed by several parents. They insisted that such acts by public schools tend to break down the separation of church and state required by the constitution's first amendment.

The Supreme Court ordered both cases argued at the same time. The argument session probably will be scheduled for February. Final decision likely will come in the spring. Appeal papers said millions of school children will be affected.

The appeal dealing with "released time" religious instruction was filed by two New York City mothers. The program as operated in that city permits release of children from classes one hour a week for religious instruction elsewhere. The students receive the kind of religious instruction specified by their parents. Children whose parents do not request such religious study remain in public school for regular classes.

The appeal questioning daily Bible reading was filed by two New Jersey parents. They opposed a New Jersey law which requires the reading of at least five verses from the Old Testament each school day. It also permits, but does not require, the recitation of the Lord's prayer.
