Young Heiress Gets Divorce

LOS ANGELES, (AP)—St. Louis' "poor little rich girl," 19-year-old Mary Catherine Reardon Gucci, has a divorce from Gabriel S. Gucci, 29, who aspires to be an opera singer.

Her interlocutory decree was granted yesterday after she testified that Gucci didn't kiss her for seven months after their elopement to Las Vegas, Nev., July 22, 1948.

"When he did kiss me, it was New Year's Eve and he was a little high," she testified.

Mrs. Gucci was left a \$500,000 trust fund by her father, J. Vincent Reardon St. Louis paint manufacturer. He was shot to death while driving his daughter and a 13-year-old boy home from a tourist cabin where he found them. She blamed the shooting on the boy, who was killed when the car went over an embankment after Reardon was shot. A jury acquitted her in 1947 of a charge of delinquency by reason of murder.

The young woman has received little of her father's estate so far, and will not be eligible for the bulk of it until she reaches 21.

Mrs. Gucci pictured her husband as indolent. He acted as his own lawyer, but when the court asked him if he wished to make a statement "as soon as possible."

He said he and his wife had been happy until she was arrested on a shoplifting charge, on which she was released into his care. He also testified that he was unaware of the St. Louis case when he married her.

House Causes Family Rift

SANTA MONICA, (AP)—RKO studio executive Noah Dietrich bought a 23-room house over his wife's objection, she says. Now she wants \$500 a month support pending trial of her separate maintenance suit.

Mrs. Carol Dietrich, 48, told the court yesterday that her husband's purchase of the large home made it impossible for her to get a smaller place which could be operated more economically.

Dietrich, chairman of the board at RKO, has denied his estranged wife's allegations of misconduct with Janice Carter, film actress, and has a cross-complaint asking for annulment or divorce on grounds of cruelty.

Mrs. Dietrich testified that her husband left her last February 9 and told her, in speaking of Miss Carter, "If you do anything to harm her I'll rip you wide open, and smear you all over the town."

Dietrich, 62, is worth \$2,500,000, his wife asserts, but she says that when they were married in 1936 he was earning \$15,000 a year and gave her \$400 a month to manage their two-bedroom home in Dallas.
