**Russky Doc Berated for Liking Pigs**

MOSCOW, (U)—The Literary Gazette scolded a Soviet doctor Tuesday for paying as much attention to his pigs as he does to his patients.

Target of the Gazette's blast was a Doctor Kuzmin, former head of a small rural hospital in Udmurtia. The Gazette declared Kuzmin's first act when he took over control of the hospital was to order that all scraps from the kitchen be turned over to him to feed his pigs.

In fact, the Gazette said, Kuzmin spent almost as much time setting up a livestock farm for himself as he did on ministering to the needs of his patients.

Furthermore, the paper said, Kuzmin ordered his hospital staff to report to him what the local gossips were saying about him. When they refused, the Gazette said, Kuzmin created nasty scenes in front of the patients and even tried to have the staffers fired.

When news of Kuzmin's activities reached the Udmurtia health ministry through party channels, the Gazette said, they did not punish him as they should have. Instead, the ministry arranged to transfer Kuzmin to a nearby hospital. This, said the Gazette, made everyone gleeful, except the staff at the new hospital.

**Air Trophy To Be Presented**

WASHINGTON, (U)—President Truman is scheduled Monday to present a coveted air trophy to the helicopter industry, the military and the coast guard.

The award is the Collier trophy, symbol of outstanding achievement in American aviation during the preceding 12 months.

Representatives of the joint winners will be:

Igor Sikorsky, who pioneered the helicopter in 1939; Secretary of Defense Robert Lovett, and Vice Admiral Merlin O'Neill, commander of the coast guard.

Winners of the annual award, first given in 1911, were announced last night by the national aeronautics association. The announcement cited the use of the helicopter in Korea troop-landings and evacuations of wounded.

**Woman Wades To Sea Death**

SAN MATEO, (P)—A young woman drove her car over 350-foot Devil's Slide yesterday, tumbled from the wreckage, and waded another 150 feet to her death in the Pacific ocean.

Papers in her purse indicated she was a bride, of less than a month.

Horified witnesses saw her drive off the coast highway 20 miles south of San Francisco. The smashed car didn't fall all the way to the water but the woman got out and staggered the rest of the way.

Deputy Sheriff Al Ludwig said a purse in the car contained the marriage license of Lucienne Quirin, San Francisco, who was married on November 19 in Reno to George Polan.

The woman wore a short sleeved blue dress and red jacket.

The body was recovered shortly after noon after a search by coast guard boat and a helicopter. The woman was face down in the water. Nearly floated a tire from the wrecked car.

Devil's Slide has been a scene of frequent tragedy, usually drownings caused by waves washing fishermen into the ocean or climbers losing their foothold.
