Prison Break Plot Foiled

SALEM, (AP)—Francis L. McConnell, 35, a guard at the Oregon state prison, has been accused of smuggling dynamite and a gun to a convict.

Warden Virgil J. O'Malley said the equipment was to be used in an escape attempt and that the prisoner who is serving a life sentence for murder, was to pay the guard back with money gained from robberies.

McConnell admitted taking two sticks of dynamite, some bullets and a .22 caliber revolver into the prison for Dupree Poe, O'Malley reported.

Poe, convicted of killing a Silverton, Ore., policeman, now is in segregation for leading an unsuccessful prison break in October.

O'Malley said that two other notorious lifers, John Omar Pinson and William Benson, were to join in the escape attempt with Poe. Benson and Pinson escaped once before and were recaptured after a nationwide search.

Capt. Ray Howard and Lt. Farley Mogan of the state police tipped him off on the escape plot, O'Malley reported.

Lumber, Sawmill Workers Meet

PORTLAND, (AP)—The executive councils of the AFL northwestern council of lumber and sawmill workers and the CIO international woodworkers of America met here today.

Yesterday the AFL committee installed newly elected council officers: John Gambelin, Lebanon, Ore., president; J. M. Hall, Twisp, Wash., vice president; Kenneth Davis, secretary-treasurer; Syd Ellin, Anacortes, Wash., warden; George Reigel, Medford, Ore., conductor.

The CIO meeting heard a report on the recent election in which Al Hartung, Portland, defeated James E. Fadling, also Portland, for the office of international president.

Reds Refuse West's Plan

PARIS, (AP)—Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei Vishinsky turned down today a revised Western disarmament proposal. He called it "wishy-washy" and meaningless.

Breaking a week-long silence, Vishinsky told the U. N. general assembly's 60-nation political committee that Britain, France and the United States had tried to persuade the world they had submitted a truly revised plan but "searching scrutiny fails to bring out any serious changes."

The Western big three followed up the deadlock in ten days of secret big four disarmament talks with revisions they thought would meet some Russian objections.

None of the concessions concerned major issues and the West stuck to its demand for creation of a tamper-proof system of inspection and control before agreeing to ban the atom bomb.

Pan American To Keep Schedules

NEW YORK, (AP)—Pan American World Airways, whose ground crew, pursers and stewardesses are on strike for higher pay, said today it expected to operate 100 percent of its scheduled flights within 24 hours.

It announced it had operated 92 percent of its normal flights since the CIO transport workers union called the strike Sunday and that trans-Atlantic operations already had returned to normal.

There has been no interruption of its Latin American and Pacific services, the airline reported.

A union negotiating committee was reported unofficially to have decided at a meeting today to recommend that strikers return to work and cooperate with an emergency fact-finding committee set up by President Truman yesterday to inquire into the dispute.

Company officials already have expressed willingness to appear before the president's committee.

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Heavy Snow Plugs High State Roads

SALEM, (AP)—Last night's storm brought heavy snow to the mountain passes, with the state highway commission warning motorists to carry chains in those areas.

The Santiam river highway, which carries traffic from the Willamette valley to Lincoln county beaches, was closed last night by falling trees at Boyer, 15 miles from the coast. But the highway commission expected to reopen it this morning.

All other points bare pavement.

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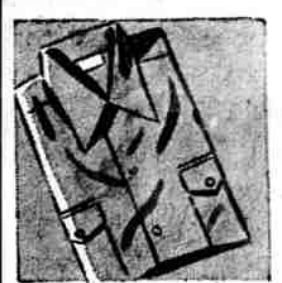
