Britain Cuts Cheese Ration

LONDON, (U) — Winston Churchill's conservative government hiked the price of cheese and bacon today and told the British people they'd have to get along with less bacon and candy.

Cheese and bacon went up a whopping 12 cents a pound. Both are rationed.

The food ministry also slashed the ration from four to three ounces per person a week and cut the candy ration by half. The changes in price and size of the ration go into effect a week from Monday.

The government blamed rising costs for the price increases and an outbreak of foot and mouth disease, which affects livestock, for the drop in bacon supplies. The disease is raging both in Britain and on the continent.

Both changes will hit the average Briton hard. Cheese and bacon are widely used to stretch out the almost non-existent meat ration.

Dead Hero On Red Prisoner List

CLEARFIELD, Pa., (U) — The name of at least one American serviceman on the official prisoner of war list belongs to a congressional medal of honor winner who was buried near Clearfield, Pa., November 6.

He was Pfc. Melvin Brown, 19-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Edward D. Brown of Mahaffey. The young hero was one of the first five to be awarded the nation's highest military honor in the Korean war. President Truman presented his parents with the medal January 9.

Pfc. Brown won the congressional medal of honor September 4, 1950, in action near Kasaan. He exhausted his rifle ammunition and supply of hand grenades — then picked up his entrenching shovel to battle the attacking enemy.

Many Names Left Off POW Roster

PANMUNJOM, (U) — Brig. Gen. Frank Allen, chief information officer for the Allied supreme commander, said today many American names "which we had hoped to see there" are missing from the Red's war prisoner list.

"There were a lot missing from the first cavalry division that thought might be on the list," added Allen, former assistant commander of the division.

He visited Panmunjom, site of Korean armistice talks, for the first time since a task force he commanded passed through on its way north in September, 1950.

Americans Will Play Santa Claus

LONDON, (U) — Santa Claus with an American accent will visit more than 1000 British children this year. They will be guests of American servicemen at parties here and at United States air force bases in the eastern countries. The enlisted personnel of United States naval headquarters here are throwing a party for underprivileged children Friday in the American embassy canteen. Leroy Jaye of Hollywood, Calif., will portray Father Christmas, as British youngsters call Santa Claus.

Woodworkers Check Close Ballot

PORTLAND, (U) — A "very close race" in which Al F. Hartung defeated James E. Fading for the post of president of the CIO international woodworkers of America, is under study here today.

Yesterday the international's 18-man executive board reviewed the work of the tabulating committee which counted the ballots in the recent election.

There were more than 100,000 ballots sent out. Hartung was reported earlier to have won the election by a narrow margin. But the count has not yet been certified.

Hartung and Fading both are from Portland.
