

Be A Calm Holiday Hostess Ready With Tasty Menus

Everybody likes to shine by serving delicious meals during the holiday season when families and friends get together, and brighten "stars" in your menus will be these reputation-builders for unusually delicious food!

Here's Carrot Pudding — spicy and filled with fruit and much like traditional Christmas puddings. But this one is much lighter in texture than old fashioned plum pudding recipes and so good you'll be asked to share your recipe. Hard Sauce adds a special "lift" to Holiday Pudding, too. It is so easy to make, too!

Broccoli becomes really Holiday fare when prepared with garlic toasted almonds! Men like this combination. Spiced Cranberry

Sauce is a real treat served plain or frozen into a sherbet. These recipes are all tested by Marian Bell Home Economist of Crescent Manufacturing Company.

CARROT PUDDING
1 cup grated raw carrots
1 cup grated raw potatoes
1 cup raisins
1/2 cup melted shortening
1/2 teaspoon Crescent imitation Butter Flavor
1/2 teaspoon Mapleine
1/2 teaspoon Crescent Lemon Extract
1 cup sifted flour
1/2 cup sugar
1 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon soda
1/2 teaspoon Crescent Baking Powder

1 teaspoon Crescent Cinnamon
1 teaspoon Crescent Allspice
Mix together carrots, potato, raisins, shortening, butter flavor, Mapleine and lemon extract. Sift flour, sugar, salt, soda, baking powder and spice into mixture and mix thoroughly. Fill well greased 1 quart pudding mold or coffee can 2-3 full. Cover tightly and steam 3 hours. Unmold and serve with hot rum sauce or hard sauce topped with Crescent Sprinx. Makes 6 servings.

What would Holiday Pudding be without its Hard Sauce! This recipe lends itself to a number of variations.

HARD SAUCE
1/2 cup butter
1 cup powdered sugar
1 teaspoon Crescent Vanilla
Cream butter, sugar and vanilla together. Spoon lightly on pudding when ready to serve. Or, for festive pudding trim, spread hard sauce into a shallow dish. Chill. Cut in desired fancy shapes, sprinkle with Crescent Sprinx. For variations, substitute one of the following for vanilla:

BROCCOLI WITH GARLIC TOASTED ALMONDS
2 packages frozen broccoli
1/4 teaspoon Crescent M.S.G.
1/4 teaspoon Crescent Ground White Pepper
3 tablespoons butter
1 teaspoon Crescent Garlic Salt

1/4 cup blanched almonds, sliced
Cook broccoli according to directions on the package, adding M.S.G. and white pepper. Melt butter, add garlic salt and almonds. Saute until lightly browned. Pour over broccoli before serving.

Cranberry Sauce always gives a "regal touch" to a Holiday dinner. If you've tired of the same old way of fixing Cranberry Sauce, this recipe for Spiced Cranberry Sauce will please you! Makes 4 cups of sauce or enough for 8 to 12 servings.

Note the clever variation, too, for Cranberry Sherbet.
SPICED CRANBERRY SAUCE
4 cups (1 lb.) cranberries
1/2 cups sugar
1/2 teaspoon Crescent Cinnamon
1/4 teaspoon Crescent Allspice
1/4 teaspoon Crescent Cloves
Juice of 1/2 lemon
2 cups water
Wash and pick over cranberries. Blend sugar and spices, add lemon juice and water. Bring to a boil and cook 5 minutes. Add cranberries and simmer until skins break, 10 minutes. Chill before serving.
Variation: Frozen Cranberry Cubes.
Freeze spiced cranberry sauce to a mush, break up with a fork. Whip 3/4 cup evaporated milk (1 small can) and 1/4 teaspoon Crescent Cream Whip until stiff. Fold into cranberry sauce, pour into freezing tray of refrigerator and replace ice cube divider. Freeze. In punch or sherbet cups with the main course, or as a dessert with cookies.
