TULELAKE—Three warrants in the name of "John Doe" were issued here yesterday afternoon for a Negro and two white men accused of beating and robbing a transient of \$185 and his car. Joe Evans, 55, told Police Chief Oscar Pedersen he was beaten over the head and dumped out of his car near the state line early yesterday morning.

Evans said he picked up the three men who were hitchhiking. He said he was enroute in his 1937 Pontiac sedan from Delano, Calif., to Eugene, Ore.

Evans said he got sleepy while driving Tuesday night and one of the trio offered to take the wheel. The next thing he remembered, Evans told police, he woke up in a snow bank, bleeding from head wounds. He staggered into Merrill and the case was turned over to the California state patrol and Chief Pedersen.
