Indians To Face Jury In Portland

Two Klamath Indians, held here since November 25 on federal assault charges, were bound over to a federal grand jury in Portland following preliminary hearings before U.S. Commissioner Bert C. Thomas this morning.

LeRoy Alvin Hicks, 25 of Chilquin, and Harold Lloyd Davis, 25, of Beatty, will be taken today to Portland by Deputy U.S. Marshal Paul Hamlin and then to Portland.

Davis is accused of knifing a California Indian, Stanley John, in a fight November 23 at Payette camp near Beatty. John was stabbed three times in the stomach and spent five days in the hospital.

Hicks is accused of shooting two Indian service officers in the early hours of November 25 on the Main street in Chilquin.

Officer Virgil Wilson was shot in the left shoulder and Officer Don Campagna nicked on the right hand.

Officer Wilson testified Hicks said the Wilsons had "tried to mess him up and he was out to straighten things out."

Then Wilson said Hicks asked Campagna about a "320" Campagna owed him for deer hides.

Campagna reportedly told Hicks he knew nothing about the "320," and then Hicks drew back from the car and said, "I'd just as soon shoot you there."

Wilson said Hicks drew a pistol, fired three shots into the government car—the third one catching Wilson in the left shoulder—and then fired two more shots before running up an alley between the telephone office and Gienger's store.

Campagna took after Hicks, Wilson said, fired three shots at him, but he got away. He was caught later by other officers.

Davis was ordered held under \$7500 bond and Hicks under \$10,000 bond.

Deputy U.S. Dist. Atty. John Brooke was here from Portland to represent the government at the hearing and Ed Branchfield, of Roberts, Kellington and Branchfield of Medford, represented Hicks and Davis.
