1st National Ups Interest

An increase of 2 percent per annum in the rate of interest paid on all savings accounts starting January 1, 1952 at the First National Bank of Portland was authorized by the bank's board of directors at its meeting today, according to Frank N. Belgrano Jr., president.

Interest at the 2 percent rate will start on January 1, 1952 and will apply to all savings accounts regardless of size at the 46 statewide banking offices.

In taking the action, First National becomes the first statewide banking institution in Oregon to announce an increase in savings interest rate.

Belgrano added that the general high level of business activity and the increased volume of business at First National were the factors which made it possible to pass the advantage of a higher interest rate on to the bank's customers.
