Students Put \$4 In Pot

WASHINGTON, (AP)—The internal revenue bureau, beset by scandal in the midst of collecting more than 60 billion dollars this year, has received \$4 from an unexpected source.

The sixth grade of the C. Russell Wilkerson school in El Monte, Calif., sent the \$4 which it won in a parent-teacher association membership drive.

In a scrawled letter with 33 pencilled signatures, the students wrote:

"We voted to give the money to the department of internal revenue to help the boys in Korea. It is not much money, but we hope that it will be of some use to them."

Revenue Commissioner John B. Dunlap, replying to the students' letter, said he found difficulty "finding the proper words to express to you the appreciation I feel for your very thoughtful and patriotic letter." He added:

"I can not advise you just what use will be made of the money to the extent of indicating whether it will be used to help pay for a form of armament to be used at the front."

"I can tell you, however, that in my opinion America's best guarantee of freedom lies not in its weapons but in the minds and hearts of its fine young people such as yourselves."

WASHINGTON, (AP)—President Truman took off at 7:58 a.m. EST today on a flying trip home for Christmas.

Accompanied by his daughter Margaret, the president headed for Independence, Mo., aboard the White House plane.

They planned to land at Fairfax airport, Kansas City, Mo., and to be with Mrs. Truman at the family home by midday. The flight takes about four hours in the president's big plane, the Independence.

Mrs. Truman was already at home preparing for the traditional holiday celebration.
