Bomb Planted At Church

MIAMI, Fla., (AP)—A stick of dynamite of the same make and strength as that used in six recent Jewish synagogue dynamite bombings was found on the steps of St. Peter and Paul Catholic church early yesterday but it failed to explode.

Chief of Police Walter E. Headly said the fuse had smoldered for a few minutes but it couldn't have gone off because the fuse wasn't correctly seated in the dynamite.

He called it an "amateur job" and said police had established a definite relation to the recent dynamiting attempts at synagogues.

Coral Gables Police Chief William G. Kimbrough said an anonymous telephone call to his home warned of the dynamiting attempt.

No explosives were found at the only Catholic church in Coral Gables.

Yesterday's dynamiting attempt was the tenth case reported to police in the Miami area since last June. One dynamite blast broke 44 memorial windows in a Jewish school and synagogue December 2 and three explosions occurred at Carver Village, Negro housing project, in the last two months.

Two one was injured by the blasts and no charges have been filed, although a few suspects were picked up and questioned.

STEALS BRIBE
IPOH, Malaya, (AP)—A former president of a branch of the Malayan Chinese Assoc. was convicted in court on charges of dishonestly converting to his own use \$70 which he allegedly received for the purpose of bribing police officers. He was fined \$167 and sentenced to nine months rigorous imprisonment.

Tough Spot For Detective

BIRMINGHAM, Ala., (AP)—A city detective who found Police Commissioner Eugene Connor and a woman in a hotel room says he will decide whether to prefer charges when he returns to work from sick leave Wednesday.

Det. Henry Darnell, accompanied by newsmen, entered a hotel room here early Friday night, finding Connor and the woman fully dressed. The officer said he pounded and kicked on the door to the room but it was not opened for 23 minutes.

Darnell at first told Connor he was under arrest, but later turned the case over to Police Capt. C. C. Huey, his superior. Huey said he "saw no violation" but Darnell could prefer charges if he desired. The city statute involved makes it unlawful "for any two persons of opposite sex except husband and wife or parent and minor child to occupy jointly and privately any room in any lodging house, hotel or tourist home in the city."

The police commissioner said in a statement that he had attended a Christmas party at the hotel and "unfortunately went into a room where I was alone with a lady." "No offense has been committed and I only regret that I was dumb enough to walk into the trap," he declared.

PARIS, (AP)—The Republic of Korea has told the United Nations the list of South Korean prisoners of war submitted by the Communists confirmed fears that the Reds "slaughtered" South Koreans en masse and forced some into the Red army.

The protest was handed to U. N. officials Saturday and made public today by the South Korean delegation headed by Prime Minister John M. Chang.

It said no armistice disregarding basic human rights will be acceptable to the civilized world.

Sisters Die, Man Helpless

LINGAN, N.S., (AP)—The bodies of two elderly sisters were found last night in their barren seaside cottage. Police said they had lain there "from two days to a week," while their blind, infirm brother groped helplessly about the house.

A whining, starving police dog was the only other living thing in the four room house where David Gracie, 82, had lived with his sister sisters, Ellen 81, and Mary 83.

Police said the two women died of malnutrition and exposure. David was taken to the hospital where his condition was described as critical.

The Gracies came from an old family which at one time owned

extensive land in this village near the Cape Breton coal mining town of New Waterford.

Neighbors did not know of their plight until last night when they saw the old man crawling about his yard seeking help.

Police said the trio had put up a few meager Christmas decorations in the house, but there was no food in the cupboard.
