Baby Bed Folds To Suitcase Size
Any mother who has ever traveled with her baby knows it is not all peaches and cream. With the innumerable odds and ends that have to be carried along especially for baby, the trip becomes almost a pilgrimage. Frequently even a bed has to be included in baby's equipment. If grandparents or other relatives cannot find an old baby bed out of the attic.
To simplify parents' traveling, a new baby bed called "Porta-Bed" has been designed to fold to a snug suitcase size. A strong aluminum frame supports a crib of sturdy cotton duck and netting. The folding waterproof mattress rests on a masonite bottom, and there are no latches, nails, or screws.
The cotton duck bed comes in a soft blue color. It is ideal for small apartments or outdoor use, as well as for trips.

ASHLAND—Fall term at Southern Oregon College in Ashland ended Wednesday and students were dismissed for a two-week Christmas holiday. Administrative offices will remain open during the vacation for regular transaction of college business, however.
Registration for winter term will begin Wednesday, Jan. 2 and classes will reconvene the following day. New students may continue to register through Jan. 16, according to Mrs. Mabel W. Winston, registrar and dean of women.

Ausland and Dodson Construction company, Grants Pass, has been awarded the general contracting bid and work is expected to be completed in time for occupancy of the building in September.

Music, Art Drama Groups Give Program
ASHLAND—A festival of arts, week-long series of evening programs featuring the music, drama, art and physical education departments at Southern Oregon college will be presented on the Ashland campus during winter term. The unique schedule has been planned to better acquaint friends of the college with various phases of cultural activity regularly carried on.
Chairman of the festival will be Glenn T. Matthews, assistant professor of music, and Leon C. Mullins, assistant professor of speech, will act as coordinator. The program will be presented during the week Feb. 11-17 and with the exception of the drama department play, all events will be held in Churchill hall auditorium free of charge to the public.
Activities scheduled on successive evenings will include a joint band and choir concert, recital for violin and piano, a panel discussion of art techniques in speech, folk dancing demonstration, musical program of ensemble and soloists, winter term play by the drama department, and concert by the Southern Oregon Symphony orchestra.
Faculty members named to supervise the festival are Angus L. Bowmer, professor of English; Marion E. Ady, and Otto J. Wilda, associate professors of art; Oscar C. Bjorlie and Helene M. Robinson, assistant professors of music; and Beverley Bennett, instructor in physical education.
