

Revenue Boss Scoffs At Idea of Widespread Firing In Face of Fresh Scrutiny

WASHINGTON (AP) — Revenue Commissioner John B. Dunlap said Thursday he doesn't expect future tax scandal firings to hit any high officials and firings among the lesser fry probably will be fewer than expected.

Further, he added, any sensational new disclosures by the Revenue Bureau or congressional investigators probably will involve past instead of present operations. Dunlap told reporters that special agents have investigated "every rumor" involving officials still in office, including all the 64 collectors in charge of regional offices.

"No officials in the revenue service of any stature are causing me any concern right now," Dunlap said. "Of course something new could pop up tomorrow."

Six of the 64 collectors were fired or resigned during the year.

Three have been indicted on bribery or fraud charges. On another front, Dunlap indicated he expects the White House to announce soon appointment of a commission to investigate how much information the Revenue Bureau should give the public.

Specifically, Dunlap said, the commission could inquire into such matters as whether any information can be released on settlement out of court on delinquent or suspected fraud cases. Another would be how much information could be released on firings on disciplinary actions such as those involved in the present scandals.

Six Wives Brings Suit For Husband

MESA, Ariz. (AP) — Preliminary hearing for six women who claim they are the wives of an excommunicated Mormon has been delayed pending a study of an appeal by their attorneys to dismiss charges of open and notorious cohabitation.

The six women, all of whom claim George Meril Dutton as their husband, were freed on \$500 bond each when they appeared before Justice of the Peace Jack Hunsaker Wednesday.

The women gave their names as Hilda Williams Dutton, 48; Arline Twister Dutton, 48; Lura Williams Dutton, 43, sister of Hilda; Hazel Doe Dutton, 55; Sarah Parkinson Dutton, 43; and Anna Merrill Dutton, 35.

Bishop Wendel A. Davis of the Alma Ward of the Mesa Stake, Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints (Mormon), had filed the charges against the women and a bigamy charge against Dutton.

So far as can be determined, authorities said, Dutton has done nothing to support his wives and 19 children. Hazel operates a small grocery store and service station in Phoenix. The others have been selling cleaning tissue from door to door. All have pooled their resources and turned the money earned over to Dutton.

STOCKHOLM, Sweden (AP)—Prince Wilhelm, 67, brother of Sweden's King Gustaf, VI, was injured slightly Wednesday after the car he was driving struck a stone pillar during a blinding snowfall. A woman occupant was killed.

Poland Eyes Iranian Oil

TEHRAN, Iran (AP) — Poland put out a feeler Wednesday to see if she could strike up a barter for Iranian oil. The tentative bid reportedly involves a half-million tons of fuel.

Poland is the second Communist land to approach Iran for oil. Czechoslovakia is sending a delegation here to talk over such a deal.

Britain has warned she would consider any Iranian oil sales illegal until the settlement of her dispute with Iran over nationalization of the British-owned Anglo-Iranian Oil Company.

Western nations, which control the world's oil tankers, have boycotted Iranian oil.

275 Marriage Licenses Issued

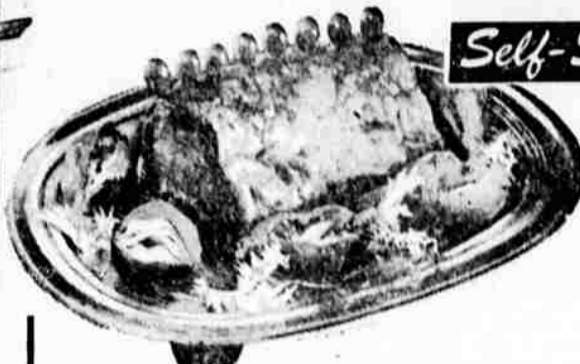
