## US Money To Go To India Soon

NEW DELHI, India (AP)—Financial aid from the United States will be made available to India under an agreement to be signed here shortly, authoritative sources said Friday.

Details and the amount involved are being kept secret in India until the signing.

Sources said the agreement would be more comprehensive than the \$1,500,000 Point Four Program signed by the U.S. and India in December, 1950. The new agreement covers both technical assistance and capital aid, they said.

## Flying Colonel Says Red Migs Better Than Sabre U.S. Skill Pilot's Savior

FIFTH AIR FORCE BASE, Korea (AP)—A flying colonel whose "boys" have shot down 139 Communist planes said Thursday American jet pilots "need more and better planes" to keep up with the growing Red air force over Korea.

"The enemy has a better airplane and far more than we have," said Col. Harrison R. Thyring, 44th Fighter Interceptor Wing pilot Sabre jets, fastest U. S. plane in combat.

He said greater skill and better training of American pilots are responsible for consistent victories. But, he added, the Reds are using Korea's Mig Alley as an aerial school where they have trained "The F-86 Sabre Jet with good 'class after class' in jet combat flying and American tactics.

"The F-86 Sabre Jet with good American team work can effectively fight against three or four to one odds," Thyring said. "Recently odds have been six to seven against us."

"While we have accomplished our missions—keeping the Migs off the fighter-bombers while they did their work—we have not been able to shoot down many of the enemy. There are never more than 50 Sabre jets in Mig Alley at one time. The Reds, with a greater force of jets on Manchurian bases, frequently have more than 200 Mig-15s up at once.

"In the last war we overwhelmed the enemy with our production," Thyring said. "But now they are overwhelming us."

Thyring, 33, is from Pittsfield, N. H.

## SDPA Plans Visit To Many Cities

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Small Defense Plants Administration expects to carry its operations into most of the nation's cities by the end of this month.

Harry Pontus, head of its field operations, told a reporter he hopes to announce the personnel of 13 regional advisory boards by mid-January, and follow that shortly by creation of regional offices to coordinate the program.

The agency was created by congress last summer to aid small manufacturers to take part in the defense program.

San Francisco and Seattle will be western regional headquarters.
