Japs Lay Off Fishing Right

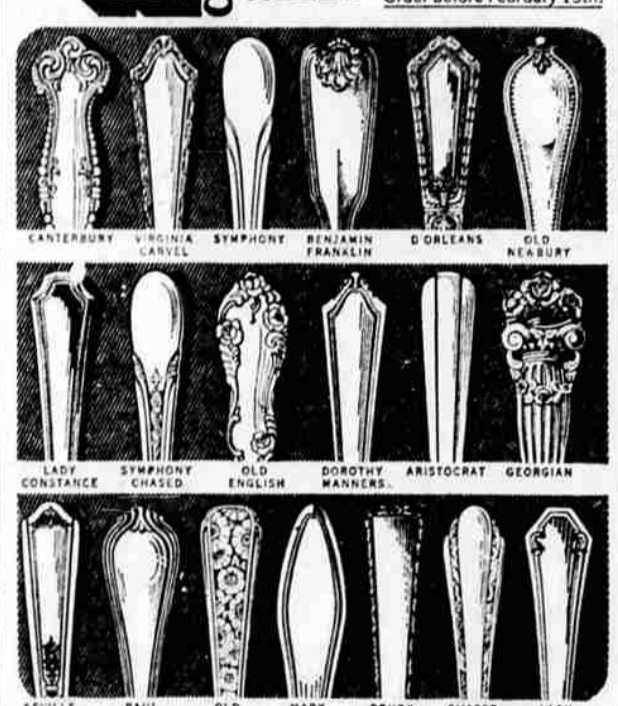
WASHINGTON (AP)—Japan has become one of the first nations to refrain from exercising its legal right to fish-eries on the high seas, Milton C. James, assistant director of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, said Friday.

Under international law, all nations have equal rights to the fisheries on the high seas. James said, however, that in the new agreement Japan recognizes that the fisheries specified are carefully managed, at considerable expense to the United States and Canada, and that entry of another nation into the field could wreck the conservation program.
