### Bad Weather Kills Travel

Crater Lake winter travel has dropped 62 per cent under last year, according to reports received here today from the National Park headquarters. Last month 455 cars traveled the park bringing in 310 skiers and 1500 others. Travel in December, 1950, saw 810 skiers in the park. Chief ranger Lou Hallock reported that the ski tow operated on both Saturdays and Sundays last winter, and is operating on Sunday only this year. Main reason for the drop off, he said, was probably the rough winter.

### Water Storage In Oregon Held Good

MEDFORD (AP) — The first snow report of 1952 indicates water storage in Oregon mountains is above average. The snow contains more moisture than usual and is piled up in far greater depths than last year, the Federal-State Cooperative Snow Survey reported. The report said the snow depth in the Willamette drainage area was 213 per cent above normal; the Umpqua 297 per cent; the Klamath 251; the John Day 176; Harney Basin 240; the Grande Ronde 156; the Powder 183; the Burnt 175; the Malheur 205; and Owyhee 282.

CONCORD, N. H. (AP) — Candidates for delegate places at the national nominating convention will begin to file papers Friday to run primary—the first in the nation.

### McCall To Go Back To Radio Work

PORTLAND (AP) — Lawson (Tom) McCall, Governor McKay's administrative assistant, will go back into radio work Jan. 15. McCall, who has been with the governor for 2 1/2 years, will again become a news commentator for Portland Radio Station KGW. He will have a 15-minute program Tuesday through Saturday at 5:30 p.m.

The voting on March 11 will afford a test of the strength of Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower and former Minnesota Governor Harold Stassen—and possibly Sen. Taft (R. Ohio) if he decides to enter. Gov. Sherman Adams, who heads the "I Like Ike" Committee, indicated he will submit Eisenhower's name after the state attorney general's office Tuesday certified

the general as being a member of the Republican Party. Attorney John W. Guider, a friend of Stassen's, has said he will sponsor the former Minnesota governor.

Certification of Eisenhower as a Republican quashed an earlier consideration by Roderick L. McKay, vice chairman of the Grafton County Democratic Committee, to file the general's name under a Democratic label.

### McClure Keeps Grange Post

PORTLAND (AP) — Elmer McClure, Milwaukie, will continue as Oregon State Grange Master for another two-year term. His re-election was announced here Tuesday. He was unopposed in the Grange primary election. The office of overseer—the Grange's second highest office—is being contested and there will be a runoff. W. G. Howes got 3585 votes in the primary, and will be opposed by Vern W. Lantz, Redmond, who got 3116. Other opponents for the final: State Lecturer — Beulah Moore, Oregon City, incumbent, and Helen Brewer, Hillsboro. Executive committee three to be elected—Bertha J. Beck, Portland; Clarence Carter, La Grande; Luke Reif, incumbent, Powell Butte; Charles Wicklander, incumbent, Portland; Ray W. Gill, Portland; and Henry Gustafson, North Bend. Secretary—Mildred Norman, Selma, and Melvina Carver, Forest Grove. Steward—Roscoe Roberts, incumbent, Medford, and James King, Baker County.

### Tax Sought To Finance Symphony

PORTLAND (AP) — Some 4600 signatures were filed here Tuesday in support of a property tax to pay for the Portland Symphony Orchestra. An organization known as the Music for Portland Committee will attempt to gather 14,062 signatures on petitions so the proposed levy can be placed on the May 16 election ballot. The levy, if passed, would raise about \$82,000.

### More Die In Egypt Battles

CAIRO, Egypt (AP) — Two British soldiers, one of them an officer, were killed Wednesday in a fight between British troops and Egyptian guerrillas six miles west of a big Royal Air Force base near the Suez Canal. A British spokesman said there were several other casualties among the British forces. Guerrillas opened heavy fire on a British military convoy shortly after daylight two miles west of the RAF base. Two hours later the British Third Infantry Brigade engaged Egyptian fighters four miles farther west. The brigade apparently had come to defend the ambushed convoy.
