

Check Forger Nabbed By FBI

CHICAGO (AP)—Robert W. Freimann, 21, was seized by the FBI Wednesday and admitted, agents said, registering 40 times for the draft to get identification cards needed to cash \$7,700 in stolen checks.

Harry T. O'Connor, head of the Chicago FBI office, said among checks Freimann stole was a \$60 government check issued to Mrs. Joe Willie Riley.

Mrs. Riley, a Gold Star mother, was classified 1-A by a draft board recently and ordered for induction. A board official said a false endorsement on Mrs. Riley's checks may have been a factor in classifying "Joe Willie Riley" 1-A.

O'Connor quoted Freimann as saying he needed the registration cards for identification in cashing checks he stole from letter boxes the past two years.

Tax Evasion Charge Filed

Charge of federal income tax evasion was filed here yesterday afternoon in the office of U.S. Commissioner Bert C. Thomas against Dr. Miller E. Cooper, dentist, 1962 Melrose St.

Dr. Cooper was released from custody of U.S. Marshal Paul M. Hanlin of Medford after posting of \$1000 bond by Keith Gramer, 239 Alameda and W. J. Kessler, 2027 Melrose.

According to the charge Dr. Cooper is accused of "attempting to defeat and evade a large part of the income tax due and owing the United States of America for the calendar year of 1945 . . . by filing a false and fraudulent income tax wherein he stated his income was \$4191.49 and the tax due was \$664 . . . wherein his net income was actually \$10,071.97 and the tax due was \$2426.63."

Dr. Cooper's attorney, L. Orth Sismore, did not indicate what action his client would take with regard to the charge.

Commissioner Thomas set no date for appearance before a federal court judge in Portland.

Fishermen Quit Bridges

ASTORIA (AP)—After two years with Harry Bridges, the Columbia River Fishermen's Union is going back to independent status.

Secretary Robert Hicks reported the union decided by a 16-vote margin to drop its affiliation with Bridges' longshore union. The fishermen joined Bridges' forces two years ago after dropping from the CIO.

Once a 2,000 member union, the fishermen now have 400 members. They lost 1,600 cannery workers when they left the CIO. The cannery workers formed their own unit and joined the CIO.

Entry Veto Brings Suit

YAKIMA (AP)—A Chinese restaurant cook says "maybe the Secretary of State made a mistake" because his two oldest children have been denied permission to enter this country.

NG Seld Poy has sued the State Department in district court, naming the highest official, Dean Acheson, and seeking to compel the secretary to aid in obtaining entry permits.

Poy's wife, the former Wong Shee whom he traveled to China to wed in 1926, and their youngest child Mary Eng, who will be two next month, arrived from the Far East two months ago.

But Poy was unable to obtain permission for NG Bat Gum, 20, and NG Chui Pan, 19, to accompany them. He filed the suit after consulting attorneys here. He began his efforts to get permission for his family to join him when travel restrictions began to tighten two years ago, contacting the American consulate general at Hong Kong.

"I was turned down in Hong Kong because I couldn't remember the answers to all the detailed questions," he said.

Wife Of Ship Skipper Waits

PORTLAND (AP)—The red haired wife of the Pennsylvania's captain waited anxiously Thursday for word of the rescue of her husband and the crew of the stricken ship.

"He's always come back safely, through the war and all, but it's certainly hard waiting and not knowing," said Mrs. George P. Plover while waiting beside her radio.

Waiting with her were the couple's two sons, Patrick, 14 and Timothy, 10.

Plover was skipper of merchant marine ships in the Atlantic and Pacific in World War II. He also survived one previous shipwreck. That was at the mouth of the Columbia River in 1939 when the Admiral Benson ran onto Peacock Spit. He was quartermaster on the ship.

ASTORIA (AP)—The Astoria- owned tuna ship Tinian is heading back from the Pacific with a leak.

The leak was found when the ship was 400 miles south of here, off Cape Mendocino, Calif.

The captain, A. A. Anderson Seattle radioed to the owners, the Columbia River Packers Association that he had turned back. The report indicated there was no danger, and that the ship would reach port Sunday.

It had been bound for Japan to pick up a load of tuna for processing here. A converted LST, the Tinian carries a 15-man crew.
