SALEM (AP) — Highways were hazardous Thursday in all of Oregon's mountain areas and in the eastern part of the state, the State Highway Commission said.

The Old Oregon Trail Highway had been closed between Union and North Powder since Wednesday afternoon, but the Commission said it hoped to reopen the route some time Thursday. Huge snow drifts were piling up on the road.

Spy Trial In Poland Pushed

WARSAW, Poland (AP) — Five more persons charged with spying for the U.S. go on trial Thursday before the Warsaw Regional Military Court.

All are accused of illegally crossing the frontier after being enlisted for espionage by U.S. spying centers in Berlin.

Three days ago five Poles were sentenced to death after a one-day trial on similar charges. A series of other prosecutions have been announced since Russia has made much of its charge that America is financing sabotage, spying and diversions in Communist nations.

The five going on trial Thursday were identified as Witold Bikulicz, Jan Kojal, Pawel Grieger, Jerzy Baron and Alfred Plenta.

Ratification Of Treaties Asked — WASHINGTON (AP) — President Truman Thursday formally asked the Senate to ratify the treaty of peace with Japan, signed at San Francisco Sept. 8.

At the same time, he asked ratification of: 1. The Security Treaty between the U.S. and Japan, signed at San Francisco last Sept. 8.

2. The Mutual Defense Treaty between the U.S. and the Republic of the Philippines, signed at Washington last Aug. 30.

3. The Security Treaty among Australia, New Zealand and the U.S., signed at San Francisco last Sept. 1.
