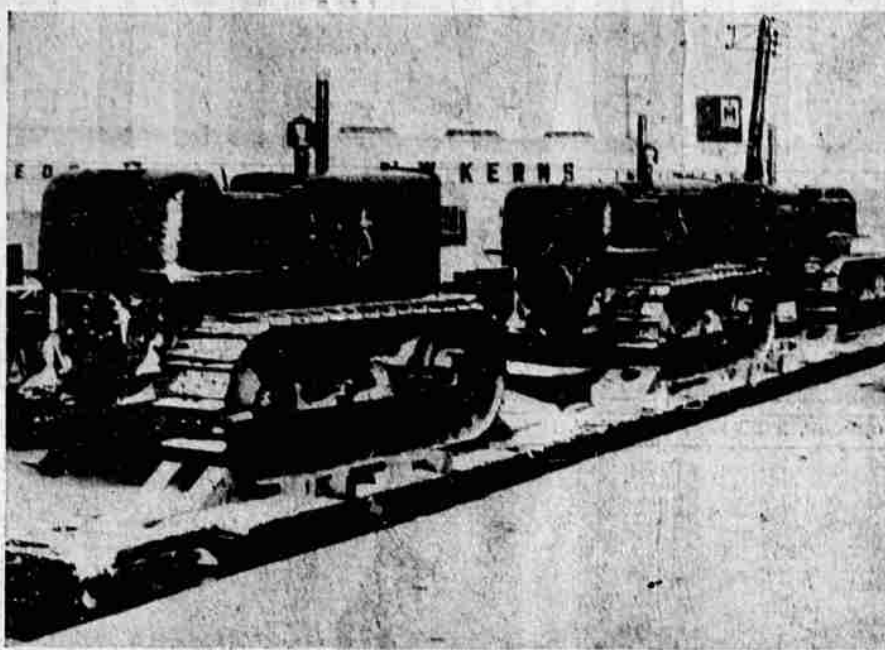

Pieces Fall From Plane

TACOMA (AP) — Three large pieces of metal fell from the sky near here Sunday shortly after an airplane had taken off from McChord Air Force base.

One chunk landed in a child's sandbox in the yard of one home, and others narrowly missed residences, witnesses said.

Earl F. Witt, a witness, said the metal apparently flew off the front of the plane. The pieces struck the earth over a half mile path three-quarters of a mile north of the base.

The witnesses said the fragments were from a B-36 bomber, but McChord officials declined comment on the report.

Crashed Plane Said Located

ANCHORAGE, Alaska (AP) — A General Airways transport plane reported missing Saturday on a flight from Portland, Ore., to Anchorage, crashed on Mt. Crillon in the Fairweather mountain range, the Air Force announced Sunday.

Searchers said there was no sign of life around the wreckage, spotted at the 9,000 foot level of the towering peak. The plane's right wing was torn off and the cockpit was smashed.

The pilot, Burton L. McGuire, 30, and the co-pilot, George A. Simpson, 27, both of Portland, were the only known occupants of the transport. They made their last report from the Cape Spencer area at 9:47 a.m., PST, Saturday, after leaving Annette Island near Ketchikan.

Vets Mail Bag

The year 1951 was a big dividend year for World War I veterans living in the Pacific Northwest, according to the Veterans Administration.

The VA reports that during the past twelve months it paid out over seventeen million dollars in dividends to holders of National Service Life Insurance who live in Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Montana and Alaska.

The payment, the second special dividend to be distributed by the VA on active N.S.L.I. policies, covers the three-year period from 1948 to 1951. The first dividend payment covered the period from the issuance of the insurance to 1948.

Distribution of the second dividend began the first of last year, the VA said, and is now about two-thirds completed. Approximately 150,000 Northwest veterans are eligible for the dividend payment.

Dividend payments by states were estimated by the VA as follows: Washington, \$7,970,000; Oregon, \$5,371,000; Montana, \$2,079,000; Idaho, \$1,732,000; Alaska, \$173,000.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK Q. I got a G. I. home loan three years ago, when the top VA guarantee was \$4,000. I understand that a law passed since then has raised the maximum guarantee to \$7,500 and that I'm entitled to another G. I. home loan guarantee for \$3,500—the difference between the old and new guarantees. May I use this new G. I. loan to build an addition to my house?

A. No. Under the law, your new G. I. home loan may be used only to purchase or build another house, and not to improve your present one.
