Kefauver Gets Oregon Bid

SALEM, Ore. 4t — Petitions to make Sen, Estes Kefauver of Tennessee the Democratic nomine for President were to go into cir-culation in Oregon Wednesday.

State Sen. Jack Bain, a Port-land Democrat, said he had or-ganized a group to sponsor the petitions. A thomand aignatures are needed to get Kefauver's name on the ballot for the Oregon pri-mars election May 16. The can-cidate's permission is not needed in this state.

So far the only Democratic entry o Oregon is Gen. Dwight Eisenin Oregon is Gen. Dwight Eisenlower, whose name was entered
before he announced he was a
Republican. The expectation now
is that his name will be stricken

Farm Land Cost Hits New Record

CORVALLIS II Oregon farm lands cost more than they ever have before.

That was the report Tuesday of the Oregon State College Extens-ion Service. The Nov. 1 price index on farm lands was 213 per cent of the 1935-39 average—14 per cent higher than on Nov. 1, 1950. The report added that farm mortgages were higher in 1951 than at any time since 1933.

WABHINGTON (In-Sen, Humphrey (D.-Minn.) said Wednesday the Democrats can't win the presidential election unless they nominate a "consistent "fair dealer" and a warm supporter of the administration's foreign policy."

The Minnesota lawmaker told a reporter President Truman would fill the bill "better than anyone else because I obviously am talking about the kind of program for which he has fought."

But Humphrey added: "We have other good Democrats who could qualify and win the election" if Mr. Truman decides not to seek another term.




