The second start was made at 1 p.m. (5 a.m. Pat.). Mechanics worked all night to repair the defective heater. Carlson and 30 other passengers slept at the airport.

The delay caused Carlson to say "I'm beginning to wonder if I'll ever get back to New York and home."

The reception at home will cap honors paid to him in London for his two weeks' battle against the Atlantic in a vain effort to get his storm-wrecked ship into port.

Taft Gets Support Of Most GOP's

SAN FRANCISCO - Sen. Robert A. Taft of Ohio is a three-to-one choice over Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower for the Republican Presidential Nomination among GOP National Committee members willing to express an opinion.

An Associated Press poll of the 93 members who represent the 46 states disclosed: Of 43 willing to state how they stand, 31 favor Taft; nine support Eisenhower, two are for Gov. Earl Warren of California, and one backs Harold E. Stassen.

Members are arriving for a National Committee meeting beginning Thursday. Western regional GOP officials planned to study their own problems Wednesday.

A similar poll taken at a meeting in Washington a year ago gave Taft 29 votes, Eisenhower 12. Thus Taft is holding his own but apparently Eisenhower has lost strength.

These results came in the face of an announcement by Eisenhower that he is a Republican and is available for the presidential nomination, although he has said he will not participate in pre-convention campaigning.

Last year's poll gave Stassen four votes, Warren two and one each to the late Sen. Kenneth Wherry of Nebraska and Gov. Thomas E. Dewey of New York. The current canvass reached 85 members. It showed that 42, or almost half are unwilling six months before the GOP National Convention to express an opinion either publicly or privately about their party's nominee.

Growers Call Halt On Move

The Oregon-California Marketing Agreement Control Committee - a potato grower committee which sets marketing standards and regulations for potatoes - yesterday postponed action on a joint vote by Klamath and Tulelake potato growers made Monday that all regulations on potatoes imposed by the committee be lifted.

The committee would ordinarily make a recommendation to the Department of Agriculture following up the growers' motion; however, the committee decided instead to await further developments by the Office of Price Stabilization in Washington, D.C.

The growers voted 43 to 28 Monday to lift the regulations which would allow them to put more potatoes - of lower grade - on the market.

Many of the Tulelake growers were against the lifting of the regulations which they said had held up the reputation of Klamath potatoes.

Scott Warren, chairman of the Oregon Potato Commission and a Klamath grower, and Louis Lyon, another grower and Klamath's representative on the National Potato Council, are in Washington, D.C. this week attending Council-sponsored sessions with the Office of Price Stabilization.

Plane May Be Used -- Again

SEATTLE (AP) - If Air Transport Associates' plans work out, a C-54 transport plane rebuilt from parts obtained in Cairo, Egypt, and a fuselage that once housed a Kentucky roadside cafe will take to the air between here and Alaska next summer.

D. R. Miller, general manager of the non-scheduled airline, told of the project Tuesday.

Miller explained that because the four-engine planes are both scarce and costly (\$750,000 each), ATA sent a man around the world looking for parts and replacements for planes now in use.

He found some of the parts in Cairo and elsewhere and located the fuselage at Louisville, Ky.

NATO Council Slates Meet

LONDON (AP) - The North Atlantic Council Wednesday called to meet in Lisbon on Feb. 16.

Announcement of the new date - the original meeting scheduled for Feb. 2 in Lisbon was postponed - was made by Lester Pearson, Canadian secretary of state for external affairs and chairman of the council.

France had asked the postponement to gain time for more discussion of the projected European army, proposed as a nucleus for the 12-nation North Atlantic Treaty Organization's military force to defend the West against Soviet expansion.

Meanwhile the French government has fallen and France is still without a Cabinet which can reach decisions on the army plan.

Italian Fashion Shows Jump Gun

MILAN, Italy (AP) - Italian fashion designers, fearful of being caught with their plans down, are exhibiting their spring creations at least three weeks before Paris.

Germine Cluff, director of Milan's Centro Della Moda, says Italian firms are starting to show their fashion collections in order to beat the French designers, who are scheduled to begin unveiling their creations Feb. 7.

To attract the heavy money-American buyers-Milan designers have created an "Italian fashion service" to help buyers from American firms.

FBI Checks On Robbery Of Bank

UNION (AP) - FBI agents have some clues on the attempted burglary of the Union First National Bank last week.

But they declined Tuesday to say what the clues were.

Hope Died Hard For Someone

VICTORIA, B. C. (AP) - Some disillusioned soul's dream of a return of the Russian czars apparently died in this provincial capital.

The appearance of several thousand rubles worth of Russian First World War bonds was the telltale evidence of the shattered hopes - or dying sentimentality.

France had stuffed into mailboxes or thrown on the street. Issues in 1916, some of the bonds had interest-bearing coupons clipped from them until mid-1922. They are a 1-year, 100-ruble issue, bearing 5 1/2 per cent interest.

Five were dropped into mailboxes and a man found one on the street.

The old Imperial Russian seal guaranteed payment of interest; on a 2 million ruble issue.

There was no clue to the identity of the person whose hope died so hard.

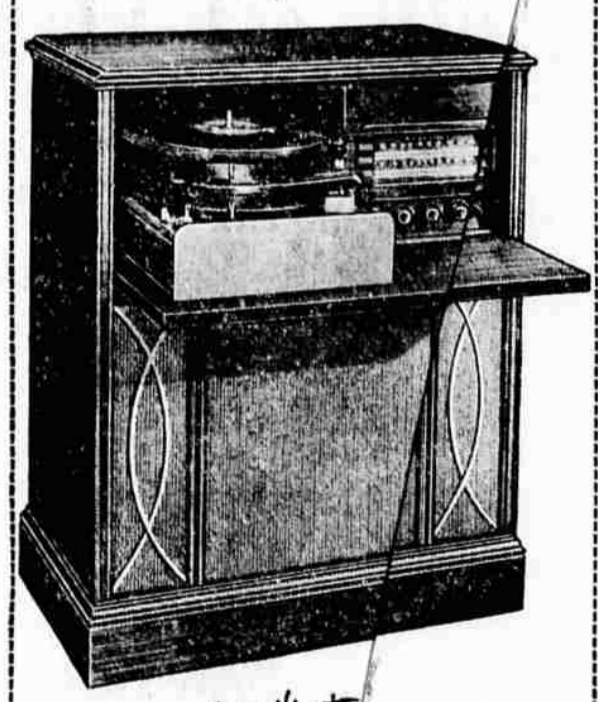
PENDELTON (AP) - There will be no opening afternoon show at the Pendleton round-up this year.
