

Pelicans Drill For Cavemen

Decided—at least temporarily—by the Medford Black Tornado, the Klamath Falls Pelicans will try to find their winning ways again when they travel to Grants Pass for a Dist. 4 Friday-Saturday twin bill basketball date with the Cavemen.

The four large A schools in Dist. 4 start from scratch again after Medford's win over the Pelis and the Cavemen's win over Ashland, both Saturday night, threw the race into a four-way deadlock.

back and he wasn't a regular last season.

But Grants Pass' shoddy 5-6 record to date doesn't give a true picture of its strength.

All six losses were close (to Ashland by two points, 43-45; 42-43 and 43-44 setbacks by Marshfield; a 58-59 loss to North Bend; a 50-51 loss to University High of Eugene; and a 34-37 trimming by Cottage Grove).

The Cavemen beat Redding, 43-45 in overtime; Roseburg twice, 45-27 and 41-33; Cottage Grove in a rematch, 44-34; and Ashland Saturday, 58-47.

Harbour starts at forward with Dick James. Sophomore Sam Dean or junior Mel Norrick will get the center call. Guards are Norm Hedgpeath and Bruce Robertson.

Paul McCall, Pelican coach, said early this week that Calvin Gilmore is still on the doubtful list. The hard-luck cager sprained his ankle late in Friday's Medford game and didn't see action against the Tornado Saturday.

Earlier in the season he dislocated a finger in scrimmage sessions.

Both have predicted victory. Both can't be right.

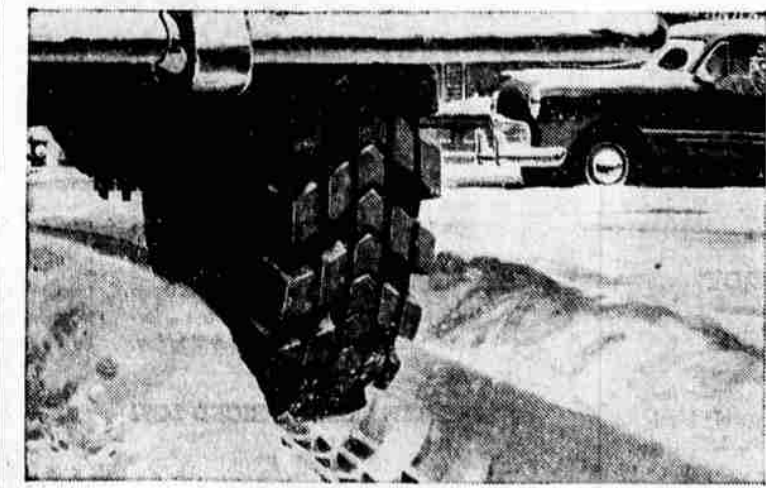
