**Nationalists Eye**  
Jap Peace Treaty  
TAIPEI, Formosa (AP) — Nationalist China said Friday it is ready to start negotiating a peace treaty with Japan.  
The announcement came more than 50 hours after the government was officially informed Japan wanted to sign a peace. China was not included in the Japanese peace treaty signed in San Francisco last fall.  
Foreign Minister George Yeh said he welcomed Japan's announced intention to have nothing to do with Communist China and "to render every assistance to the United Nations in all its measures to stem aggression."
