Schubert High In 77-45 Win

If Oregon Tech missed Don Schubert last night, it wasn't noticeable to the fans of Eastern Oregon as the Owls blew hot in the second half to wrap up a handy 77-45 victory over the Mountaineers.

It was Oretch's first conference win and pulled the Owl quint out of the Oregon Collegiate Conference cellar.

Six of the Owls took a big whack at the score column and it was merely a case of Oregon Tech having too many guns for the visitors who lost their 14th game in an away effort.

Bob Quinn's Mountaineers missed the services of one of their starting forwards, Jerry Poyer.

The Owls wrapped it up with a third-quarter 21-point onslaught while Eastern Oregon was being held to 11 points in that frame.

That gave the Hilltoppers a comfortable 57-35 lead as the two teams slid into the last frame.

The Oretch reserves worked most of the fourth quarter and added 20 for good measure.

Early in the contest, Eastern Oregon punched out its only lead of the game, a five-point advantage on Jim McAlister's bucket.

But Mary Hammack tied it with a free throw and Tom Schubert scored his second field goal of the game to give the Owls an 8-6 lead.

The Owls held a 34-21 intermission lead from that point.

Schubert, although fouling out midway in the third quarter, nonetheless walked off with scoring honors, 14 points on seven field goals.

But Jerry Wyatt, Homer Duncan and Jack Pinkley took up where Schubert left off to pace the Owl scoring in the second half.

Barl Green, a digger-doodle Eastern Oregon guard, started off like he meant business with three field goals in the first half plus two free throws, but he was checked to just one from the floor after the rest of the game.

But Green's 10 led the invaders, while Center Lowell Kolaba, EOC's leading scorer, finished with nine.

The game started slowly, with both teams sparring for an opening end of a fast break with two minutes gone to give the Owls an early 2-0 lead.

The two teams tied again tonight at approximately 8:15. The junior varsity opens the show at 6:45 against Chiloquin of the Klamath Basin league.

Wade (Svends) Halbrook and his Lincoln mates, rated No. 7 in the Associated Press Oregon High School basketball poll, didn't even let the first game go by without smashing Portland League Prep records.

Halbrook, seven-foot-one-inch tall center, poured in 57 points Friday night to erase his old individual city mark of 51 as he paced Lincoln to an 83-46 victory over Washington in a league opener.

And the Lincoln total wiped away the high mark of 79 held by Jefferson.

Both of the old league records were established last year, when Lincoln won the city crown.

Halbrook set a new individual state scoring record, 86 points, against Molalla week ago. Friday night's scoring brought his total to 335 this season.

There were no upsets in Portland league openers, which highlighted a long schedule of Friday night games.

McMinnville, fourth rated in the state, preserved its undefeated record in high school play by trimming Portland, 61-51.

Marshall, ranked No. 7 and looking stronger every time out, walloped Coquille, 67-52, in a class A district 5 game. Milton-Freewater rated eighth and also improving fast, outclassed La Grande, 46-32.
