Kurt Von Poppenheim, sadistic Prussian wrestler, picked up the \$300 bonus as winner of the battle royal last night at the armory. But it took a Good Samaritan act by young Billy Parks as an assist.

Each had a fall in the main event, spots they earned by surviving the grueling, wild battle royal, the show-opener.

Then Parks had Von Poppenheim bouncing on his backside with flying butts. But the German slipped out of the way on the third rush and Parks was stopped from landing out of the ring by Referee Buck Davidson who inadvertently got in the way.

His back was to the German. The Proud Prussian lost little time in wrapping Parks up for his dreaded backbreaker and stretch.

That gave him an extra \$300 that he lost less time in collecting at ringside.

Von Poppenheim won the first fall with the Boston Crab after Parks had missed a flying scissors, the third in a series that had the monacled German groggy.

Parks evened matters with a leverage hold he called the Sunset Flip. It took five minutes, 10 seconds. But the last go-round took just 10 seconds longer.

"The 13 rules that were in effect in Scotland in 1744 are just as good today," Ouimet, current captain of the Royal and Ancient Golf Club, said at the New England left handed golfers' dinner Wednesday night.

"The more we monkey with the rules, the less fun the game will be for all of us," he added.

Ouimet endorsed the unification of the British and United States golf rules that became effective Jan. 1 and suggested "only such future changes as would become absolutely necessary."
