Klamath Blanks Roseburg

While the Klamath Falls Pelicans were sweeping a two-game series with non-district Roseburg over the weekend here, Medford was piling up a plucky lead in the Div. 4 basketball race with two key wins over the Grants Pass Cavemen.

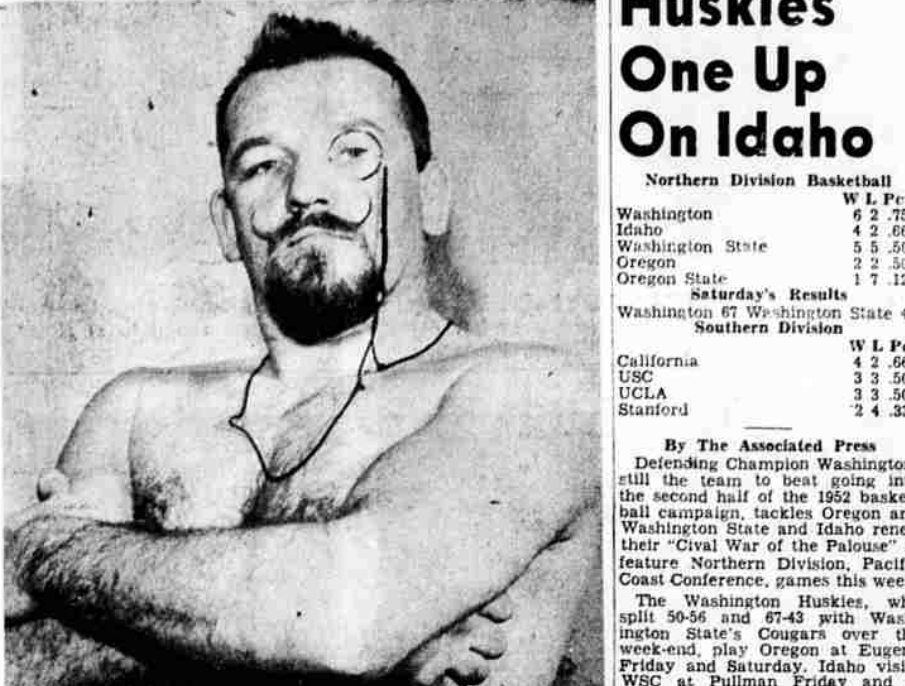
Reedsport dumped Myrtle Creek, 63-36, to retain its lead in the Western division.

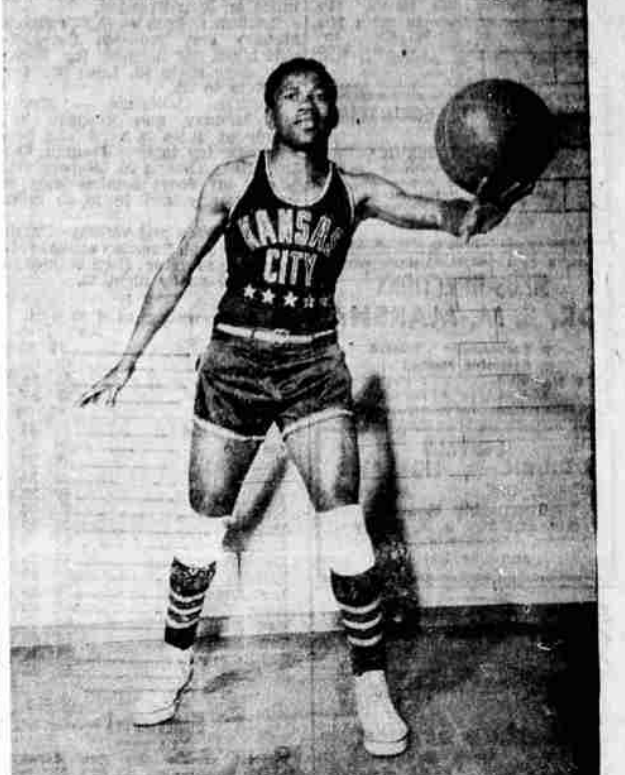
A top-drawer wrestling feud will be set Wednesday night at the armory in a tag team match that promises the acme in thrills.
