LONDON (h — The Conservative government declared Tuesday Britain must slash her imports by another 150 million pounds, or 420 million dollars, a year to help head off national bankruptcy.

The cut, which comes on top of another of 350 million pounds ordered two months ago, was announced in the House of Commons by Chancellor of the Exchequer R. A. Butler.

The government dalled on the British people for a supreme elfort to step up production and export estnings.
