Women Study At Meeting

The Klamath Lesgue of Women Vpters meeting Jan. 23 at the Pellean party room discussed the problems of state legislative apportionment.

Discussed were these questions: Why is the 1916 census used as the basis for apportionment today? Is population the best basis for apportionment? Should we support the proposed amendment to

la population the best basis for apportionment? Should we support the proposed amendment to the state constitutions which would require the aupreme court to respontion the legislative district?

Four maps of Oregon were posted with colored lines indicating present and proposed menate and house legislative districts.

Mrs. Hal Ogle led the discussion and made several suggestions (1) Zone the more populous districts so voters can know their representatives instead of voting a long list of names. (2) Limit the number of counties and the number of square miles in any one district square miles in any one district to give less populous areas just representation. (3) Increase the representation. (3) Increase the number of senators so represen-tation could be increased in populous areas without taking away any in other parts of the state. (4) Give publicity to the problem so people will insist that the legisso people will insist that the legis lature do the job of reapportion ment as planned by the father


