## Harold Ickes Funeral Today

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Truman will attend the funeral services Wednesday for Harold I. Ickes, former secretary of the interior who died last Sunday.

The President arranged to pay his final respects at the church services for his one-time associate. Ickes, self-styled "Old Curmudgeon," succumbed to complications of an arthritic condition. He served as secretary of the interior longer than any man, from 1933 until 1946, and headed the Public Works Administration during the depression.

Among honorary pallbearers were Bernard Baruch, Supreme Court Associate Justices Black, Douglas and Jackson; Sen. Douglas (D-Ill.); Hill (D-Ala.); Magnuson (D-Wash.); O'Mahoney (D-Wyo.); Tate (R-Ohio) and Tobey (R-N.H.); former Secretary of the Treasury Morgenthau; Commissioner of Reclamation Michael W. Strauss; former Vice President Henry A. Wallace; and Columnists Walter Lippmann and Drew Pearson.

## Property Tax Idea Backed

PORTLAND (AP)—James T. Marr, secretary of the State Federation of Labor, doesn't think a special session of the legislature should be called to write a new tax bill.

In fact, he doesn't think a new tax bill is necessary at all. That is what he said Tuesday in reply to a suggestion made recently by Fred Paulus, deputy state treasurer.

Paulus said that unless the state got new income it might have to begin deficit financing.

Marr said the forecast of a state deficit was "absurd."

He said the present tax base

would permit a property tax which would bring the state 17 million dollars a biennium.

There have been no property taxes in Oregon for a number of years. Income tax surpluses have made property taxes unnecessary.

Marr said he thought "the unsatisfied longing of the sales tax advocates" was "behind the clamor for a new tax."

Voters have rejected sales tax proposals five times since 1933.
