

Secret California Tax Hearing to Be Resumed

 SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—Congressional tax probes resume secret sessions Thursday after hearing troubles of the San Francisco Internal Revenue office blamed on a clique of Democratic officeholders.

That was the testimony Wednesday of William E. Frank, of Seattle, treasury agent who made a four-month investigation of the scandal shaken tax office, and H. H. Sikeleather, of Oklahoma City, head of a team of Internal Revenue Bureau auditors.
