Duke Embarks For England

NEW YORK (AP) — The Duke of Windsor has sailed for England to attend funeral services for the man to whom he gave Britain's throne—his brother, George VI.

He was traveling aboard the liner Queen Mary, due at Southampton next Wednesday. His wife stayed behind in New York.

It was a somber Duke who boarded the ship here Thursday night, a black band of mourning on his arm. "This voyage," he said, "is indeed sad—and it is all the sadder for me because I am undertaking it alone."

Beside him stood his duchess—the American for whom he abdicated the throne.

He said he was returning to his homeland not only to attend the funeral but also "to comfort her majesty, my mother."

"This will be the fourth time that I have participated in the obsequies of a British monarch," the former king said.

"Fifty-one years ago it was my great grandmother, Queen Victoria; then nine years later my grandfather, Edward VII; and in 1936 my father, George V. Now, by God's will, it is my brother's turn to lie in state in the great hall at Westminster and eventually to join his forebears at Windsor."

Women Seek Tax Refunds

WASHINGTON (AP) — Income tax refunds totaling \$34,503 are sought by two women operators of a Portland, Ore., clinic.

Ruth Barnett Bush and Beatrice Cook, in petitions filed with the U.S. court of claims, contend they overpaid their taxes by that amount while operating the Stewart Clinic.

Involved are taxes for 1945, 1946, and 1947.

Mrs. Bush seeks refund of \$25,625 with interest. Miss Cook asks \$8,877.

They contend overpayments resulted because "through inadvertence" they failed to claim allowable deductions for operation of the Stewart Clinic and failed to claim an allowable loss for giving up the Barkool Clinic which they purchased for \$23,000 and operated less than a year.

Candidates who file by petition do not have to sign the pledge that they will support the candidate who wins the state Republican presidential primary.

Capture Ends Long Search

WASHINGTON (AP) — Harry H. Burton, long sought on murder charges in Los Angeles and one of the FBI's 10 most-wanted men, was taken into custody at Cody, Wyo., Thursday.

FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover announced the arrest.

He said Burton offered no resistance and admitted his identity when special agents confronted him at an automobile agency where he had been employed as a salesman the past four years.

Hoover said that during this period Burton has been living with his wife at Powell, Wyo., and using the name "Winston L. Jeter."

Burton, now 49, is charged with the killing of a bystander during a robbery Oct. 1, 1947.

OSC Turkeyman Wins \$500 Award

James A. Harper of the Oregon State college agricultural experiment station was awarded the \$500 national turkey research award for 1951 by the National Turkey Federation at its recent annual meeting in St. Louis, Mo.

The cash award is presented each year by the federation to the research worker who has made the outstanding contribution in turkey research for the year. Harper's work on turkey management problems, antibiotic feeding experiments and fertility and hatchability studies was cited by the award committee as the nation's outstanding achievement in the turkey field.

Harper is leader of turkey research projects for the OSC experiment station. He has been largely responsible for developing the stations current outstanding program of turkey studies. He is the first Pacific northwest scientist to win national recognition for turkey research.

HOLLYWOOD (NEA) — Behind the Screen: They may have to bill it as Zsa Zsa Gabor versus George Sanders, but gorgeous, zippy Zsa Zsa and cynical, bored George will be co-starring for Fox in a re-make of "Music in the Air."

John Boles and Gloria Swanson warbled their way through the first film edition, but the new version is being tailored to George's talents as a singer and Zsa Zsa's dancing know-how.

"Yes," cooed Zsa Zsa on the set of "We're Not Married," "George and I are anxious to work together."

The state of their wobbly, listing marriage?

Zsa Zsa lifted her sculptured chin and answered with the assurance of Capt. Carlson:

"It's all right. We are together and it looks like we will last forever."

"When George went to England to do 'Ivanhoe,' I was a hausfrau. When he returned, I was an actress. It was very confusing to George. Now he accepts it."

The singing cowboy who yodels two choruses of the latest sagebrush hit parade tune while trotting into the sunset on his horse is a TV casualty.

Even the melodic tonsils of Roy Rogers have been silenced in his switch from big theater screens to the home entertainment boxes in half-hour movies with wife Dale Evans.

Roy's explanation for parking his trusty guitar:

"We've less than half an hour to tell a story. If you put in music, it slows up the action. Besides, we've found that kids don't go much for music. Unless we get a lot of requests for singing, we'll keep doing a straight action series."

Patrice Wymore may be wearing gingham as a western belle in Warners' "Man With a Gun," but she's not the waiting-on-the-dorothy-in-the-sun-dress fragile type. "This girl," she told me, "has a point of view and she's not afraid to pick up a gun."

There's even a hair-pulling, arm-chewing battle between Pat and luscious Lina Romay.

"We're having a ball," says Pat. "One minute we're laughing and the next we're slugging each other."

Pat and hubby Errol Flynn go to Jamaica when the film is completed for Flynn's \$200,000 lawsuit against Duncan McMartin, who has used Errol as his private punching bag. Chuckling about Errol doing the suing for a change, Pat grinned: "He said something very funny about it the other night but darned if I can remember it."

There are no sighs of regret from Will Rogers, Jr., the Beverly Hills newspaper publisher who popped a wad of gum in his mouth and combed his hair down on one side to play his famous dad. Now that cameras have turned for a week on "The Story of Will Rogers," he's saying:

Navy Cancels Bomb Tests

SPOKANE (AP) — The Navy yielded to mounting protests Thursday and cancelled scheduled depth bomb tests in North Idaho's Pend Oreille Lake.

Acting Mayor Willard Taft said Rep. Horan (R-Wash.) reported the Navy will look elsewhere for a site to conduct the experiments, Taft said.

Earlier, the City of Spokane had threatened to go to court in an effort to block the explosive tests. The city contended explosions beneath the surface of the lake might damage underground passages and cut off Spokane's water supply.

Sportsmen also protested the plan after Sen. Welker (R-Idaho) had charged the tests would wipe out fish life in Pend Oreille Lake, home of the giant Kamloops trout.
