

**Forecast** 

Lower lamb prices this year were forecast at the recent six-teenth annual meeting of the Western Oregon Livestock association. Gerald Stanfield, Weiser, Idaho, of the can-making firm, said costs of harvesting pole beans and economic pressure from bush bean areas "point toward modification of the Blue Lake industry's cultural production methods to take advantage of the mechanical picker."

"A new type of bean plant will be needed if the industry in the west is to keep its advantageous position." said Dr. Hatfield. This proposed bean can be developed, but it will take considerable time."

Dr. Hatfield said that in 1950 there were 12,000 acres of green beans in the Pacific Coast states and Utah. Almost the entire acreage was planted to Blue Lake
