Carlson won the first fall of the semi-finals with the flying head scissors after bull-dogging Herb. That took 28 minutes.

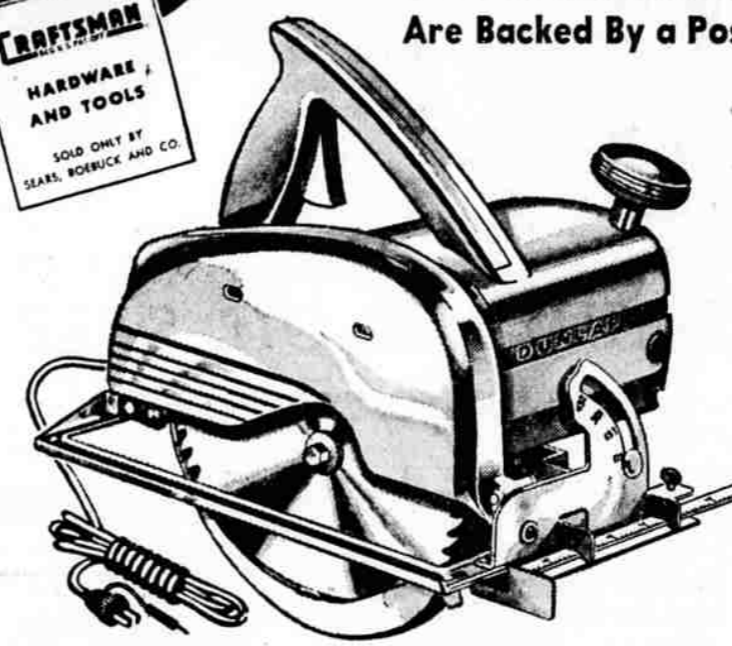
