### **Morse Backs Joint Chiefs**

WASHINGTON & In a Senate peech, Sen. Morse, R-Ore., Thurs-ay denounced attacks on the Joint

Chiefs of Staff.

He also hit at what he termed 
"the growing war clique in the 
United States" which, he said, 
wants to risk "a war with Russia." 
"It is a great public disservice," 
he said, "in the midst of a partisan 
campaign to make statements 
which shake confidence in the 
leadership of our military men." 
Morse did not single out any 
particular person, nor mention 
specifically the remark of Sen. 
Taft of Ohlo, a Republican Presidential candidate, that "I have no 
confidence in the judgment of the 
present chiefs of staff." 
Taft had said at a Seattle news 
conference that he "certainly 
would" remove present military 
jeadership if he becomes president, 
and that he also "certainly would 
make use" of the abilities of Gen. 
MacArthur, deposed Far East commander.


### **Accidental Burn Fatal to Child**
