

Undemocratic Ouster Voted

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — A Chinese family, voted out of a white neighborhood on the eve of brotherhood week, was swamped Monday with offers of welcome from across the country.

Sing Sheng, 25-year-old air line mechanic, said his telephone hasn't stopped ringing since Saturday, when white residents of South San Francisco's Southwood Tract voted 15-23 they didn't want him as a neighbor.

Sheng had suggested the balloting, explaining "I was sure everybody believed in democracy."

The Shengs could have insisted on their right to occupy the house. The U.S. Supreme Court has ruled home ownership because of race or creed is not enforceable.

Southwood residents said they objected because property values would decline if the former officer in the Chinese Nationalist Army moved in with his American-born wife and two-year-old son.

The Shengs, who are expecting another child next week, reclaimed the \$2,850 they deposited on the \$12,300 home. They hoped to get back deposits on \$1,000 worth of furniture.

Govt. Reform Forces Rally

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Citizens Committee for the Hoover Report assembled Monday to mobilize a last-ditch effort at further government reforms before going out of business May 31.

Among the committee's major targets are the government's two billion dollar a year medical services, the massive Veterans Administration and the sprawling Department of Agriculture.

President Truman sent a message of welcome and announced he will recommend further reorganization plans to Congress this year. Of the 37 reorganization plans so far submitted, 28 have been approved and one is pending — the reshuffle of the Internal Revenue Bureau.

But the American Legion Sunday greeted the committee with a blast at what it called its "fantastic" and "outrageous" proposals to streamline the V.A. and Secretary Brannan accused the committee of being "destructively critical" of the Agriculture Department.

The privately-supported committee is headed by Robert L. Johnson, president of Temple University, Philadelphia. Former president Herbert Hoover will address Monday night's final session of the one-day meeting. He headed the bipartisan commission which drafted the reorganization plans for the entire executive branch of the government and submitted them to Congress three years ago.

Johnson announced Sunday that the citizens committee, formed to lobby the Hoover recommendations into law, will disband this spring to "avoid becoming involved in politics" during the election campaigns.

KAYSVILLE, Utah (AP) — Seven members of a wedding party, including the bride and groom, were killed Sunday when their car crashed into a semi-trailer truck.

Killed were: Martin Edward Green, 22; his bride, Nellie June Wilson Green, 16; Ralph E. Green, 37 brother of the groom and driver of the death car; Mrs. Edna Wilson, the bride's mother; Mrs. Elynis Christensen, 38, aunt of the bride and Gen. Charles Wadsworth, 38, all of Ogden, Utah, and Mrs. Clarence Sharpless, 33, of Clearfield, Utah.

The young couple had been married Saturday. Trooper Farlin Wood of the Utah State Highway Patrol, said the Green car failed to negotiate a curve on U.S. Highway 91 at the entrance to Kayville and crashed into the trailer.
