School Bond Issue OK'd

LAKEVIEW — In a special election Friday, voters of School District No. 7 (Lakeview) approved two measures for the improvement of the schools.

A \$270,000 bond issue for construction of a new 16-room intermediate grade building was approved 346 to 165. The school board voted to add for the bonds because of present crowded conditions plus the forecast from the school census which indicates coming increases in enrollments.

The second proposal, approved 454 to 61, was a matter in which the School Board asked authority to sign a 10-year lease with the Lake County Youth Foundation for using the Youth Center as a kindergarten. The Youth Foundation agreed to spend \$15,600 of funds from the J. McDonald-Truman Colling Trust Fund in adding two rooms at the Center and to lease the building to the district without rental.

Arnall succeeds Michael V. Dulles, who resigned to seek the Democratic nomination for the U. S. Senate in Ohio.
