Saturday night's final gun ended a good game for a large crowd of the basketball faithful on Pelican Court—but it was probably the most welcome sound followers of the Pelicans have heard this year. Double Victory Does It

OSLO, Norway (AP) — Norway swept into first place in the winter Olympic games team race Monday by scoring a brilliant double victory in the 18-kilometer cross-country race and the Nordic combined.

Halvor Brenden, a hardy Norwegian skier over home territory, won the 18-kilometer cross-country race in 1:01:34—the fastest time ever made for the distance in the history of the winter Olympics.

Simon Slaetvik, winner of the ski jumping half of the combined Sunday, travelled the 11 1/4 mile hill and dale course in 1:09:40 seconds to clinch victory in the two-event competition with an unofficial point total of 450. Heikki Hasu, defending champion from Finland, had 444 1/2 points.

The 20 points for the first two places alone vaulted Norway from third place in the unofficial team race past Austria, the previous leaders, and the runner-up United States.

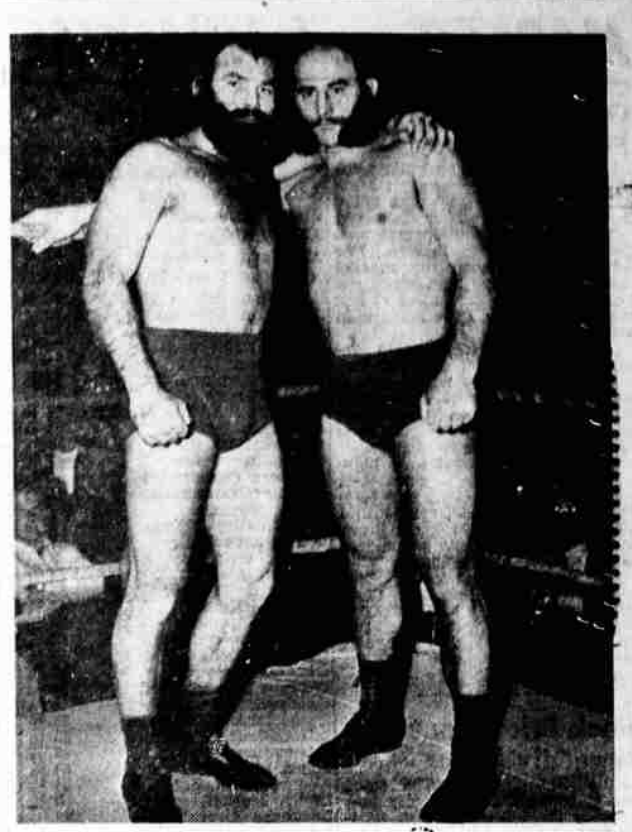
The U.S. was shut out of points in both the cross-country and combined events as expected.

The Americans suffered their biggest disappointment so far Sunday when they were blanked in the women's downhill ski race.

Andrea Mead Lawrence of Rutland, Vt., fell twice and finished 17th.

Mrs. Trude Jochum-Beiser of Austria won the race.

Betty Weir, an Omaha, Neb., typist who began skiing only four years ago, was 19th. Katy Rodolph, cover girl from Hayden, Colo., was 23rd and Jannette Burr of Seattle, was 27th.
