

OSLO M. — A 26-year old, in-defatigable Finnish woodcutter, Veikko Hakulinen, won the 50 kilo-meter Olympic cross country ski race Wednesday in three hours, 33 minutes and 33 seconds.

America's four ski racers, badly beaten in the shorter 18 kilometer Monday, decided not to try to match the hardy Scandinavians in exhausting marathon and so

Hakulinen slögged home, legweary and gaunt-faced, four minutes and 38 seconds ahead of a fellow countryman, Eero Kolehmainen, who was timed in 3:38.11. It was Finland's first gold medal of the current games.


